DIVISION OF NURSING DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Clinic:

The immunization program is orienting Rose Wang, the new CDC Public Health Advisor to SNHD. Bonnie Sorenson and Veronica Morata-Nichols attended the Program Managers Meeting in Atlanta conducted by the CDC. The meeting dealt with future allocation formulas and the new inventory distribution center issues.

1. Ravenholt Immunization Clinic

The clinic serviced 3,951 clients and gave 8,519 vaccines. All clinics of SNHD serviced 9,450 clients and gave 19,467 vaccines.

2. The Outreach Program:

November 26th through the 30th was National Influenza Vaccination Week. The Health District held 2 special flu clinics that week. One clinic at the Gold Coast Casino on November 28th, and one clinic on Tuesday, November 27th at Martinez Middle School.

All flu vaccine that was ordered has been received. Approximately 6,200 doses of flu were administered during the month of November. The program continues to do flu clinics in the community.

B. Immunization Project:

Training Classes

The Vaccination Education Class for those requesting an exemption is set to hold its first session. The policy was completed and signed in November. It was also presented to the Board of Health at the November meeting. Staff are now being educated on how to present this to the public.

We are currently preparing for a community event to educate the community about the new Tdap mandates for seventh graders that will be implemented this coming fall.

Miscellaneous

A second mumps outbreak occurred at a casino. We continue to coordinate with EPI to respond to vaccination needs.

C. Vaccines for Children (VFC)

1. We have a total of 181 providers in Clark County. There are 179 active providers and 9 inactive providers.

Our two quality Assurance Review Coordinators had completed their year's VFC Quality Assurance Review Site Visit.

Two providers were reassessed for immunization rates series of 4-3-1-3-3-1 (4 Dtap, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 3 Hib, 3 Hep. B, 1 VAR) and age ranging from 12-35 months.

The Coordinators reviewed 30-40 charts per visit. They do the data entry to the CDC Software (CoCASA). They also check both the State and SNHD WebIZ for patient immunization information and print a copy for the provider's records.

The VFC providers were reassessed for immunization rates <80%. The providers revisited were:

- Pioneer Pediatrics - immunization rate for their 24-35 months increased from 50% to 76%
- Kidfixers Pediatrics - immunization rate for their 12-35 months increased from 63% to 93%
- North Las Vegas Family Health Center - immunization rate for their 24-35 months decreased from 75% to 70%
- Children's Urgent Care - Sunset - immunization rate for their 24-35 months increased from

24% to 50%.

2. Feedback done on 6 providers:

VFC Coordinators discussed with the Clinic Medical Director, clinic manager of designated clinic staff the results of the Immunization rates summary/diagnostic/missing immunization reports. Discussed with the provider strategies on how to improve their immunization rates especially if the rates are below 80%.

- Will meet with Linda Platz from the State of NV regarding the VFC Program;
- Meetings: Immunization staff meeting; Policy Manual meeting.
- oriented Pediatric resident to the VFC Program.
- Immunization Exemption meeting.
- Met with the 2 Regional Directors of the NV Health Center regarding their immunization rates for their clinics.
- WebIZ survey for the upcoming CDC visit in December 3-4, 2007 was completed.

II. Community Health Nursing Program

A. Maternal Child Program (MCH) Home Visitation:

On November 6th, 2007, Community Health Nurses (CHN) participated in the Homeless Project held at Cashman Field. It was well received by the public. Services provided included Vaccines For Children and flu, Adult flu, Healthy Kids exams, Fluoride Varnish applications and Well Baby Checks.

On November 15th, the CHN Team Leaders conducted a career fair for Clark County School District high school students at Nova Southern University who might have a desire to be in the medical profession. The Team Leaders presented the different roles/functions of nursing and different services provided by the Health District. It was well received by the students.

On November 16th, Team Leaders made presentation to community partners of children with special needs about the different services of MCH Program.

Out of the 57 referrals received in the Community Health Nursing Program, 51 were in Neonatal Intensive Care Units, and 7 were for Child Protective Services.

B. Congestive Heart Failure (CHF):

Referrals were accepted from November 1st to the 15th. During this time period a total of 14 referrals were received, of these referrals 4 met admission criteria. Three new clients received service in November.

Following the October 24th presentation at Sunrise Hospital on the SNHD CHF Program, we have not yet received any referrals from Sunrise Hospital for CHF.

The CHF nurse has resigned and all referrals for CHF clients will be handled by the Community Health Nurses in the interim period.

C. Lead Program:

Three cases were opened for Blood Lead Levels above 10. Two of the cases included Environmental Investigations. Currently we have 11 open cases, and 1 closed case.

A Primary Prevention meeting was attended and projects done for the National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week were discussed and reviewed. Contributions in primary prevention include Lead Rap, a video on lead poisoning donated to the program by the State of New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services, Division of Family Health Services. It is now playing in the lobby in English and Spanish. The English version is 4 minutes and the Spanish version is 5 minutes long. We now also have Sesame Street, "Lead Away" which is a video (15 minutes) for the education of children and adults, starring the familiar characters of Elmo and Oscar the Grouch. These all can and will be used during prescreening of children, along with educating in the lobby of the Health District.

Families First Conference for parents of children with disabilities was attended by SNHD with the Lead Program being represented in a panel like discussion of health issues involving children and services provided by the health district.

The new Lead Hot-Line number is 759-1283. We now also have a listserv site for members of the lead staff.

D. Healthy Kids Team and Kids Clinic:

During November, the team participated in the Families First Conference at UNLV providing information about the programs and services available at the District.

A Neighborhood Project was held at Ernie Cragin Housing. The healthy kids team organized this project and coordinated with Southern Nevada Immunization Coalition and the housing authority to provide immunizations, exams, fluoride varnish applications, blood pressure checks, and information on lead poisoning, covering kids, and other services available in the area.

III. HIV/STD

A. Prevention Services

Four outreach activities were conducted in November.

1. On November 3rd HIV testing and counseling was provided in Moapa for the Las Vegas Paiute Tribe Pow-Wow.
2. On November 6th HIV testing and counseling for the Las Vegas Standown at Cashman Center sponsored by the Nevada Homeless Alliance.
3. Every Thursday 1:00 p.m. through 6:30 p.m., HIV testing and counseling and Hepatitis A and B vaccinations are provided at the Gay and Lesbian Center.
4. Every Tuesday 12:30 p.m. through 3:30 p.m., HIV testing and counseling is provided for clients of Clark County Social Service PATHS Program.
5. Education on HIV Fundamentals held for SNHD staff and community-based organizations on November 14th 10:00 a.m. through 3:00 p.m.
6. World AIDS Day Name Project/AIDS Memorial Quiet Display from November 26th through December 3rd at the Gay and Lesbian Center.

B. STD Surveillance

1. Total syphilis reported to STD surveillance for November 11/01/07 through 11/27/07:

- Primary syphilis - 2

2. On November 1st, Chris Reynolds was interviewed by the Review-Journal and Channel 3 concerning the increase in syphilis cases in Clark County and the contributing factor of the internet (Craig's List).

3. On November 2nd, Tracy Ford, CDC Public Health Advisor for STD, on assignment for SNHD, was a presenter at the March of Dimes Conference entitled, Healthy Babies, Healthy Families at the Orleans Hotel. Her presentation, STDs – High Stakes Gamble, was well received.

B. Tuberculosis Clinic

In November, TB clerical staff participated in the Public Health Foundation Enterprises work group to offer input into the work flow of health cards in collaboration with the tuberculin screening. The final draft was reviewed and signed off by this team on 11/14/07 using intranet SharePoint (internal IT tool).

November 14, 2007 – The T.B. team drafted the following documents: organizational chart, job description and a reconfiguration plan of the work space to possibly acquire a CDC Public Health Advisor assigned to Clark County. Outcome is pending.

November 15, 2007 – the task force comprised representatives from the police, UMC, legislature, and SNHD met again on the work that has progressed regarding noncompliance with NRS 441.A and NAC 441.A 180. The police reported the client under the house arrest program is doing very well.

Refer to the monthly narrative for details of individuals' cases and elaboration on the contact investigations.

Oral boards were held for the purpose of filling the vacant nurse supervisor position. Final interview of the candidates are slated to occur at the end of November 2007.

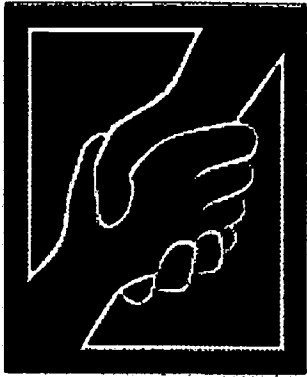

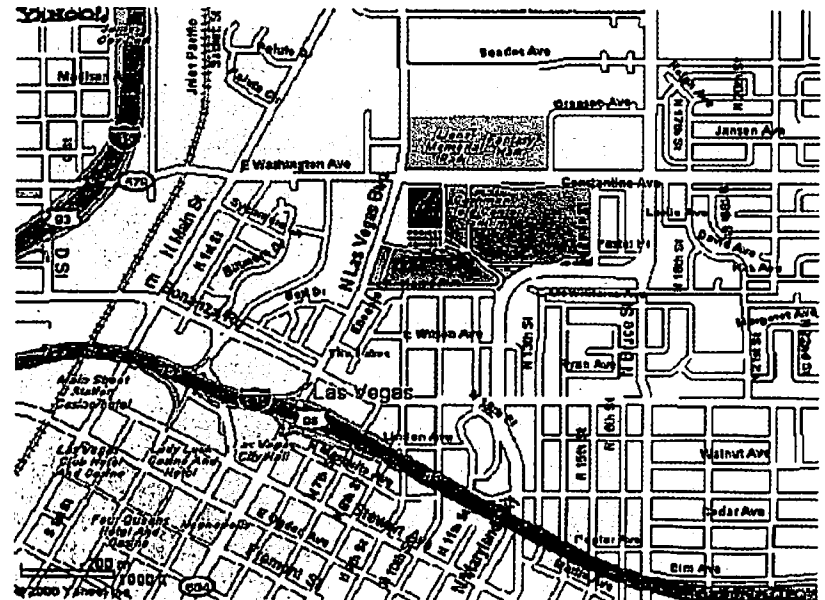
