# **DIVISION OF NURSING DIRECTOR REPORT**

### I. Immunization Program

# 1. Immunization Clinic Activities

- **A.** 156 Hope World Wide reminder calls were made to parents of children between the ages of 19-35 months.
- **B.** Merck and the Outreach Program for Vaccine Series Completion mailed 6,281 reminder postcards to adolescents and young adults (11-26 years) for those who need to complete their HPV vaccine servies.

#### 2. Immunization Outreach Activities

- A. Immunization staff conducted two child care center clinics for flu/Tdap vaccines; December 10 at Creative Kids-Fort Apache, 9 clients with 11 vaccines given and December 11 at Children Choice-Sunset, 4 clients with 7 vaccines given.
- **B.** Immunization staff provided vaccines for an outreach event targeted to the homeless population. Rainy weather was an issue for transporation by Metro and numbers were much less then expected. The event was at the Hope Christian Center on December 12 with 5 adults and 11 vaccines given.
- C. Immunization program staff completed training for the transition of the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Agency (SAPTA) program. Staff will assume all duties and responsibilities as of January 5, 2015.

# II. Community Health Nursing Program

### 1. Child Care Health Consultation (CCHC)

- A. Three classes were provided at two different facilities by the Child Care Health Consultants (CCHC) in December 2014.
- B. There was one new lead case for the month of December.

#### 2. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has enrolled 581 low income, first time mothers since its inception in 2008. At present, the six Nurse Home Visitors are

serving 139 clients. 53 are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership is one of the evidence-based home visiting program sites participating in the national Maternal and Infant Home Visiting Program Evaluation (MIHOPE) - Strong Start, a study designed to assess the effects of home visiting services on maternal and infant health. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) may use the results of the evaluation to help formulate Medicaid reimbursement policies. 49 clients are now enrolled in the Strong Start study. The District's Nurse-Family Partnership program is committed to enrolling 150 study participants through September 2015. The program was formally recognized for its participation in the Maternal and Infant Home Visiting Program Evaluation (MIHOPE) by the National Service Office of the Nurse-Family Partnership Program with a Certificate of Achievement and Appreciation.

# III. Office of HIV/AIDS/STD- Prevention, Care, Surveillance

# 1. Prevention Services/Community Activities

High Impact Screening Sites that SNHD conducted activities at during the month were:

- A. Richard Steele Health and Wellness Center
- B. Gay & Lesbian Center
- C. World Aids Day was held on December 10, 2014. SNHD offered free rapid HIV testing in the SNHD Sexual Health Clinic.

# 2. Sexual Health Clinic (HIV and STD Care Services)

During December, staff has worked diligently to prepare for implementation of the Electronic Medical Record System, Netsmart. During the month of January, all staff will participate in training. Implementation is scheduled for February 2, 2015. In addition, during the month of December, Sexual Health Clinic staff conducted training with the Immunization program on the duties of the SAPTA program.

## 3. Surveillance

In the month of December and the next few months going forward, we are contacting people who have HIV but have not seen a doctor or been in care for the past year. We are providing them referral information to get them back into care.

We have also been working on a new way to build a consistent Quality Assurance (QA) data query that will be generated every two weeks to closely monitor data quality. The surveillance team continues to work on monitoring labs reported from laboratories and providers, chart reviews, Chlamydia and Gonorrhea phone interviews, follow up on Out of Jurisdiction and assist the Disease Investigators with record searches.

# 4. Staff Facilitated/Attended Educational Presentations/Trainings

- A. HIV 101 on December 10, 2014.
- B. Female Prostitution Prevention Project-HIV/STD Training on December 6, 2014.
- C. Orasure Technology training on Rapid Hepatitis C Testing on December 19, 2014.

#### IV. Tuberculosis Clinic

1. TB Clinic/Surveillance Activities

- A. Medical Center Update: Screening for all potentially exposed clients, staff, students and family members is ongoing at this time, infant surveillance will continue for another 2 months. Both children are asymptomatic and are being followed by a medical provider.
- B. Outreach Activity: Ongoing outreach events conducted at numerous Clark County Medical Centers/Hospitals.
- 2. There was 4 new active cases reported in December 2014.
  - A. 3 new Adult cases
    - a. 1 USA Male with a history of kidney transplant
    - b. 1 Foreign Born Female
    - c. 1 Foreign Born Male
  - **B.** One new pediatric case reported in December 2014.
    - a. 1 USA Female High School Student attending CCSD.

## V. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- 1. Special Projects, Reports/Events
  - A. On December 13, 2015, TPP staff participated in the Economic Summit and Student Leadership Conference hosted by the Las Vegas Urban League and other community organizations at the College of Southern Nevada.
  - **B.** During the month of December, TPP staff held outreach activities at the following six high schools; Clark, Canyon Springs, Rancho, Valley, Western and Desert Pines, reaching a total of 444 youth.
  - **C.** During the month of December, the TPP program's social media campaign reached a total of 3,268 unique new visitors on the "condomsensenv" website and 333 new likes on the TPP's Facebook page.

### **VI. Family Planning Summary**

Recruitment efforts have been ongoing for several months for a second Nurse Practitioner in Family Planning. The recruitment has been expanded to Physicians Assistants as well.

Due to the backlog in Nurse Practitioner service appointments at the East Las Vegas Public Health Center, Family Planning services will have to be further curtailed at the Henderson Public Health Center beginning January 1, 2015. Henderson clients requiring examinations will be referred to East Las Vegas. Henderson Family Planning services will be limited to services not requiring examinations such as Birth control refills, pregnancy tests, emergency contraception, limited STD testing and counseling.

### **VII. Nursing Administration**

- 1. Student Interns
  - **A.** Touro University Nursing students continue their clinic rotations.
- 2. CPR Training
  - A. Staff is current on CPR training through December 2014.
- 3. CEU Educational Opportunities
  - A. Nursing will continue to retain Nevada Nursing Board approval to provide Continuing Education credits for District nurses.
