RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Clinic Activities

1. Henderson Immunization services opened to the public on January 9, 2017 with 26 clients receiving 33 vaccinations for the month of January. The new clinic is located at 874 American Pacific Drive, Henderson, NV 89014. Clinic hours are Monday through Friday 8:00-4:30pm and closed from 1:00-2:00pm.
2. Hope World Wide Program provided 53 successful reminder recalls for children 19-35 months.
3. Televox reminder recall program provided 122 successful reminder recalls for children 6 weeks through 4 years old.
4. A site visit was conducted at Riverside, CA for the new SNHD mobile clinic on January 25,

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

1. Immunization services @ The Center (LGBTQ) on Mondays and Wednesdays provided 139 vaccinations for 59 clients
2. Mexican Consulate Clinic (823 S. 6th Street, Las Vegas, NV 89101) on January 9, 2017. 18 clients received 43 vaccines
3. La Familia Medica Clinic (2465 Reynolds Avenue, North Las Vegas, NV 89030) Adult Flu Clinic on January 19, 2017. 17 clients received 37 vaccines.

II. Maternal Child Health Nursing Program

A. Child Care Health Consultation (CCHC)

1. One class provided to a local child care facility by the Child Care Health Consultant.
2. There was one new elevated lead case referral received during this month.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

1. The NFP program currently has 121 active clients. Fifty clients are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (MIECV) made available through the NV Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act.
2. The team continues to participate in the Continuous Quality Improvement activities mandated by the MIECHV program.

C. Healthy Start Initiative (HSI)

1. The HSI has enrolled 285 at risk participants since March 2015. Seventy-six infants have been born into the program since March 2015. Two case managers and one team lead are currently serving 101 active participants.
2. The HSI team continues ongoing activities to support families to meet project goals and improve women's health, increase access to quality services, strengthen families' resilience, achieve collective impact and monitor performance/outcomes. HSI Project Coordinator and temporary contracted Outreach Worker are coordinating outreach opportunities and recruitment of new referring community partners in targeted areas. HSI program staff was trained on a new data collection system (ChallengerSoft Prime) and are currently implementing its use for the data collection of new program screening tools.

III. Ryan White Care Services (HIV)

1. The HIV-Intensive Medical Case Management (MCM) program served 140 patients this month. Two new pregnant women were referred to the program and five babies were born with perinatal exposure to HIV. Exposed newborns and infants are followed in case management for periodic HIV testing until cleared at approximately four months of age. The Perinatal HIV hospital trainings continue through partnership with the Ryan White Part D subgrant recipient, Nevada Care Program. To date, 192 key hospital staffs in 6 area hospitals have attended these trainings.
2. Early Intervention Services (EIS) program has filled the Social Worker position to serve as Linkage Coordinator. The program uses strengths-based approaches to link people living with HIV (PLWH) who are new to care, returning to care, new to jurisdiction, or detention facility discharge to HIV medical care within 30 days of referral.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (SHC) (HIV and STD Care Services)

The Sexual Health Clinic front desk position, vacant for 6 months, has been filled as of January 3rd. SHC staff as well as other SNHD programs welcomed for the first time Physician Assistant students (Touro University) for Public Health observational rotations this month.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. Two new active adult cases and no new pediatric cases were reported to the TB Clinic.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 80 clients with twenty clients (25%) requiring communicable disease follow-up.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community based organizations in the community.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: TPP staff held outreach activities at Rancho High School, Desert Pines High School, Cheyenne High School, El Dorado High School, Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth and the Statewide Youth & Family Mental Health Engagement Summit reaching 689 youth.
- C. During January, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THNKnevada Facebook page reached a total of 6,220 likes and 15,462 individuals were engaged in it. The twitter account reached 636 followers and had 3,669 impressions. The THINK website had 362 unique users, 206 new users and 83 returning users and the Instagram page reached 553 followers and 140 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served a total of 667 clients; of which 647 were unduplicated.
 - 1. The East Las Vegas family planning clinic served 407 clients (397 unduplicated clients).
 - 2. The Decatur family planning clinic served 260 clients (250 unduplicated clients).
 - 3. Family Planning received the notice of award on 1/20/17 for the non competing continuation of grant submitted on December 30, 2016.

VIII. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Student Interns/Clinical Rotations: Nevada State College and Touro University had scheduled Clinical Services rotations at SNHD this month.
- B. CEU Educational Opportunities: Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Clinical Services Nursing staff. 1.5 CEU's were provided through three trainings his month.
