RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Immunization reminder program provided 73 successful via telephonic calls for children 6 weeks through 4 years and postcards without appropriate number of Pevnar doses on July 15, 2008.
2. Annual Immunization training was provided to SNHD employees in preparation for back to school in 4 scheduled sessions with a total of 57 attendees. Nurses received 1 CEU for training.

B. Immunization Program Activities

1. Mobile Unit Clinic at Windmill Library was held on July 18, 2018; administered 25 vaccines to 15 clients.
2. Mobile Unit Clinic at Skyview YMCA on July 9 and July 23, 2018: administered 23 vaccines to 15 clients
3. Mobile Unit Clinic at Wells Park Henderson on July 24, 2018; administered 20 vaccines to 9 clients.
4. Mobile unit clinic at the Clark County Library held on July 25, 2018; administered 17 vaccines to 8 clients.
5. Adult Clinic at the Mexican Consulate on July 23, 2018; administered 33 vaccines to 21 clients.
6. Hepatitis A Campaign for Homeless in partnership with Nevada Homeless Alliance held at G&L Center on July 17, 2018; administered 3 vaccines to 1 client.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

1. There were three new lead cases in the month of July. One case was a transfer from California.
2. There were 5 new referrals from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 133 active clients. Forty-eight are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting

(MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

The program has served 938 mothers and 559 infants since its inception in 2008.

Healthy Start Initiative (HSI)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start program has enrolled 661 at risk participants since March 2015, when enrollment began. 177 infants have been born into the program since March 2015. At present, two case managers and the team lead are serving 216 participants total.

The SNHD's Healthy Start Initiative (HSI) team has continued ongoing activities to support families in meeting project goals to improve women's health, increase access to quality services, strengthen families' resilience, achieve collective impact and monitor performance/outcomes. This month Healthy Start Program presentations were provided to: Safe Nest Resident Program, Las Vegas Clark County Library District – Young People's Library, Raising Las Vegas Initiative and West Care Women's and Children's Program. This month's outreach included: Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority Event-Annual Health Fair at Matt Kelly Elementary School and Lied Memorial Boys and Girls Club Family Resource Center.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A. Three pregnant women and two newborns with perinatal HIV exposure were referred to the SNHD medical case management program in the month of June. Infants perinatally exposed to HIV are followed for periodic HIV screening until cleared, at approximately 4 months of age.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (STD Care Services)

- A. The Sexual Health Clinic (SHC) provided direct clinical services to 903 clients this month.
- B. HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and Hepatitis screening continue to be offered at the SHC.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. Four new active adult TB cases, and no new pediatric cases were reported by the TB Clinic during this period.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 40 clients (28 Adult and 12 Pediatric).

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community based organizations in the community.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: During July, the TPP program participated in two back to school health fairs sponsored by the Department of Family Services and the Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority. 100 health fair participants received information about family planning services, sexual health and community resources.
- C. During May, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THINKnevada Facebook page achieved a total of 5 new likes for a total of 6119 likes. The twitter account reached 727 followers and has 104 impressions. The THINK website had 179 unique users, 123 new users

and 13 returning users. The Instagram page reached 736 followers and 96 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served 511 clients; 490 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 263 clients; 256 of them were unduplicated.
- C. The Decatur Family Planning clinic served 248 clients; 234 of them unduplicated.

VIII. Family Health Clinic

- A. The Family Health Clinic performed 23 exams for clients seeking school, college, university, employment physicals and children preventive health services in July 2018. During Back to School July 30-August 17, 2018 Family Health Clinic will be providing school, sports and day care physicals Monday-Friday 8:00am-3:30pm.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 288 prescriptions for 189 clients.
- B. Assessed/counseled 12 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Assessed/counseled 40 clients in the Tuberculosis Clinic.
- D. Assisted 29 clients to obtain medication financial assistance.
- E. Assisted 1 client with insurance approvals.
- F. Referred 0 clients to community partners.

X. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in July.
