- Didactic course content to meet both AAMS and local requirements
- Clinical course content to meet both AAMS and local requirements
- Successful demonstration of the following procedures:
 - All procedures as listed on the "Physician Advisor Verification Form"
 - ➤ All procedures as listed on the "Skills Proficiency Record"
 - > Five endotracheal intubations on a human patient
 - Five central venous line placements, either live or simulated
 - > Two catheter thoracostomies, either live or simulated
 - > One surgical cricothyroidotomy, either live or simulated

After receipt of the above, the EMS-RN may contact the EMSTS office to schedule to take the ALS Licensure examination. The EMS-RN has three attempts to pass the exam, after which time he/she must wait one year from the last attempt to reapply.

If the EMS-RN passes the ALS Licensure examination with a score of 80% or higher, a letter will be sent out advising he/she is approved to begin an internship that consists of no less than 120 hours of field experience (rotor wing and CCT EMS-RNs only).

After receipt of a letter from the agency's medical director documenting successful completion of the internship, the EMS-RN will be asked to come to the EMSTS office to take a photo for an "Endorsement" card allowing him/her to function as an EMS-RN in Clark County.
