## Important Request from CDC Reporting Burkholderia cepacia (B. cepacia) Clusters

## Situation:

## General Information about B. cepacia

Burkholderia cepacia [burk-hōld-er-uh si-pay-shee-uh] (also called *B. cepacia*) is the name for a group or "complex" of bacteria that can be found in soil and water. *B. cepac*ia bacteria are often resistant to common antibiotics. *B. cepacia* poses little medical risk to healthy people; however, people who have certain health problems such as weakened immune systems or chronic lung diseases, particularly <u>cystic fibrosis</u>, are more susceptible to this bacteria. *B. cepacia* is a known cause of infections in hospitalized patients.
