LAS VEGAS – The Southern Nevada Health District and its community partners will join with the National Alliance for Hispanic Health to host ¡Vive tu Vida! Get Up! The event will feature free health screenings including blood pressure checks, low vision screening, and childhood lead poisoning screening as well as disease prevention information. Also a diabetes and cholesterol check lab test will be available for a \$5 fee.

This year, the "Artery Explorer" will offer attendees the chance to take a virtual tour of the heart to help illustrate the importance of cardiovascular health and ways to promote good heart health.

"This is an opportunity to help families live healthier lifestyles. Take a walk with your family, learn a new dance, there are many little steps that can make big differences in health," said Dr. Jane L. Delgado, president and chief executive officer of the National Alliance for Hispanic Health.
