Clark County Health District's Air Pollution Control Division Issues Penalties for the Month of July

(Las Vegas, Nev. – August 5, 1999) – During the month of July the Clark County Health District's (CCHD) Air Pollution Control Division (APCD) issued the following penalties for violations of air pollution control regulations. Only penalties totaling \$2,000 and above are reported.

Thatcher Chemical Company was penalized \$2,000 for allowing fugitive dust emissions to be generated from a tank trailer at its Continuous Bleach Plant located at 850 West Lake Mead Drive.

Hanson Aggregates, a.k.a. Bonanza Materials Inc., received a \$2,000 penalty for allowing fugitive dust emissions to be generated from stockpiles and road surfaces from the upper portion of its site, located in North El Dorado Valley.

Sandia Construction, was penalized \$4,000 for allowing visible emissions, in excess of the amounts listed in its Authority to Construct, to be generated from an asphalt plant exhaust stack at its non metallic minerals process facility, located on Lake Mead Drive, east of Sunrise Mountain.

Progressive Contracting, Inc. received five separate violations for allowing emissions of visible air contaminants at its asphalt plant in Moapa Valley and for failure to comply with a Corrective Action Order on four separate occasions. They received a total of \$10,000 in penalties.

Terrravita Home Construction Company (a.k.a. Del Webb Anthem County Club) and Wadsworth Gold Construction Company received penalties in the amount of \$4,000 and \$2,000 respectively, for allowing fugitive dust emissions to be generated by loading of haul trucks, scrapers and travel of heavy equipment at their 778-acre residential country club community.

Las Vegas Paving Corporation was penalized \$4,000 for failure to take reasonable precautions to control fugitive dust and for allowing fugitive dust to leave the plant lot line at its sand and gravel pit near the southeast corner of Sunset Road and Eastgate Road.

Western States Contracting received a penalty of \$2,000 for allowing fugitive dust emissions to be generated from construction work at its 87-acre development, Anthem Coventry, located on Eastern Avenue.

Rose Hill Limited Partnership received a \$7,000 penalty for failure to comply with Dust Control Permit Conditions at its 10-acre residential development located at the northeast corner of Alexander Avenue and Clayton Street.
