## The Black Church Week of Prayer for the Healing of AIDS

(Las Vegas, Nev., - February 25, 2002) – To mobilize Black churches in the effort to promote AIDS education and compassion, the Clark County Health District, Sista to Sista, and F.A.C.T. (Fighting AIDS in our Community) is collaborating with the organization The Balm in Gilead, to sponsor the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Black Church Week of Prayer for the Healing of AIDS on March 3-9, 2002. The Balm in Gilead is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization with an international mission to stop the spread of HIV/AIDS throughout the African-American community.

During this year's week of prayer, churches' roles in addressing AIDS awareness will be highlighted. Each year, a growing number of Black congregations are developing AIDS prevention outreach programs, supporting and caring for persons living with HIV/AIDS and establishing HIV testing facilities with counseling services.

Additional activities will include African American church leaders at both the national and local level calling for a national state of emergency regarding the rising rates of AIDS cases in the United States. Based on 1999 data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), more African Americans were reported to have AIDS than any other racial/ethnic group. Rates among African Americans are twice the rate for Hispanics and eight times greater than Caucasians.
