Hearing officer penalizes mobile home park owner

(Las Vegas, Nev., - April 21, 2004) – On April 21, 2004, the Clark County District board of Health's Solid Waste Management Authority Hearing Officer penalized David DiMarco \$10,000 for disposing of raw sewage in trenches dug behind mobile homes at College Inn Trailer Park, located at 4615 E. Lake Mead Blvd.

DiMarco is the subject of a court order to abate nuisances at another local mobile home park. On April 9, 2004, and again on April 13, 2004, DiMarco was ordered by Municipal Court Judge Bert Brown to abate nuisances at the Sky Vue Mobile Home Park at 15 W. Owens in Las Vegas before persons are allowed to occupy the premises. The nuisances found at the Sky Vue park included raw sewage flowing onto the ground and accumulating in pools under and adjacent to occupied dwellings.

Clark County Assessor's office records show the property owned by a corporation, but Nevada Secretary of State records show the corporation in default. David DiMarco is listed as an officer of the corporation and admitted to health district investigators that he owns the College Inn Trailer Park.

DiMarco did not appear at the hearing before the Solid Waste Management Authority Hearing Officer though served by certified mail. DiMarco was order by the hearing officer to remediate the area affected by the sewage, and could be subject to further penalties for failure to comply.

The health district will continue its investigation and re-inspect the properties to ensure compliance with public health regulations.
