SIZE:

This facility, as proposed, will consist of approximately 65,340 square feet (all exterior). The maximum storage capacity is approximately 1000 cubic yards. The maximum processing rate is approximately 250 cubic yards per day.

OPERATIONS:

This facility is seeking a permit from Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) to operate a recycling center. A recycling center is a facility designed and operated to collect, store, or process only recyclable materials which have been separated at the source of waste generation from other solid waste and which will eventually be shipped to others who will use those materials to manufacture new products. This facility will accept batteries (alkaline, automotive, rechargeable); E-waste (cell phones, transformers & electrical equipment, computers, hard drives, microfilm, microfiche film, optical drives, tapes, x-ray film); metal (ferrous and non-ferrous); organic debris (pallets/wood); paper (all types); and plastic (all types).

This facility will operate Monday – Sunday, up to 10 hours per day. Operations will take place outdoors and there is outside storage. The facility will be open to the public Monday - Sunday, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5: 00 p.m.
