



INSTRUCTIONS FOR RECIPROCITY APPLICANTS

DEFINITION: A reciprocity applicant is an individual who has current certification from National Registry or State of Nevada.

The following items must be submitted for an EMT certification application to be processed by the Southern Nevada Health District Office of EMSTS:

- 1. A completed application. Applicant must be at least 18 years of age at time of application.
NOTE: Applicant must provide proof of residency, enrollment in EMS training, or employment with a Clark County permitted agency prior to certificate issuance.

- 2. Non-refundable certification fee.

- 3. Copy of government-issued photo identification card.

- 4. Documentation of successful completion of a course of training as defined in EMS Regulation 300.800.

If the applicant's initial training is beyond two (2) years and the applicant has maintained state certification, the applicant must submit documentation of completion of a current state approved refresher training program appropriate to the applicant's level of certification. Refresher training programs must be completed within the past two (2) years and meet or exceed the requirements of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation Refresher Training Program, National Standard Curriculum.

- 5. A current, valid Healthcare Provider CPR card. If applying for paramedic certification, a current ACLS card. Reciprocity applicants have one year to obtain PALS or PEPP card, and proof of attending a PHTLS, BTLS or ITLS course.

- 6. Proof of completion of a SNHD approved Weapons of Mass Destruction Training course. An applicant who has not completed this training will be required to do so within two years of initial certification.
