6-64 years	1 dose	1 dose First dose: ≥2 months after the last dose of original vaccine
6 months to 5 years	2 doses Second dose: 1 month after the first dose	1 dose If received 1 dose of the original vaccine First dose: 1 month after the last dose of original vaccine 1 dose If received 2 doses of the original vaccine First dose: ≥2 months after the last dose of original vaccine



¹ The updated vaccine are called "updated" because they protect against both the original virus that causes COVID-19 and the Omicron variant BA.4 and BA.5. Two COVID-19 vaccine manufacturers, Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna, have developed updated COVID-19 vaccines.

² Previous versions of the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines are called "original" because they were designed to protect against the original virus that causes COVID-19. The original versions of both of these vaccines are no longer available.

Those who are moderately to severely immunocompromised may get 1 additional dose of the updated vaccine. Talk to your health care provider for more information.
