### Continuous Disinfection of Aquatic Venues

- National shortage of trichlor tablets
  - AH Inspectors have been violating a lot of pools not for maintaining proper disinfection levels
  - At all times chlorine must be maintained at:
    - Without Cyanuric Acid (1.0-10.0 PPM)
    - With Cyanuric Acid (2.0-10.0 PPM)







## Continuous Operation of Circulation


- Many circulation systems have been found nonfunctional due to reasons such as stolen and turned off pumps.
- Poor communication between management and operators have resulted in pools in bad condition.
- If a pool is open the circulation system must be kept in continuous operation 24 hours per day.
- If the aquatic venue's circulation system is broken nuisance conditions must be avoided.



The pool company must maintain a list of current employees servicing commercial aquatic venues and be able to produce the list upon request. The employees must have a current national certification from a training course that meets the criteria outlined in the most current Model Aquatic Health Code (MAHC) and must register with the Southern Nevada Health District for a Qualified Operator card.
