Variance Request to Operate a Public Bathing Place not in Compliance with the Nevada Administrative Code 444.134(1) Pool Deck Obstruction

[Assessor's Parcel Number (APN)162-16-801-001]

I. BACKGROUND:

OLCC Nevada, LLC, d/b/a Las Vegas Desert Club is petitioning for a variance as requested by Adalberto Lugo, General Manager of Las Vegas Desert Club (See Attachment A: Nevada Secretary of State Corporation Information), to operate a public bathing place not in compliance with Nevada Administrative Code 444.131(1), which states in part:" 1. ... a clear, unobstructed deck must be provided around the entire perimeter of a pool. In no case may the width of the deck be less than 4 feet (1.2 meters). A deck may be obstructed for a distance equal to not more than 10 percent of the perimeter of the pool if:

- (a) The design of the obstruction does not endanger the health or safety of persons using the pool;
- (b) An unobstructed area of deck not less than 4 feet wide is provided around or through the obstruction not more than 15 feet (4.55 meters) from the edge of the pool; and
- (c) Written approval for the obstruction is obtained from the health authority before construction or installation of the obstruction.

II. RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is of the opinion that there exist circumstances which satisfy the requirements for a variance. The granting of this variance will not be detrimental or pose an unreasonable risk to public health and safety. The facility was originally constructed with the waterfall creating the

public health and safety. The facility was originally constructed with the waterfall creating the deck obstruction of 23% of the pool perimeter in 1989 and there have not been any documented issues with regard to the deck obstruction to date. Handholds are present along the base of the waterfall allowing for bather's use when necessary, should they surface at the waterfall.

III. <u>CONDITIONS</u>:

The petitioner request a variance (See Attachment B: Variance Candidate worksheet and Attachment C: Variance Application Letter)"... to maintain the current waterfall structure at the pool..."

The property owner must ensure that the area is maintained in compliance with all other applicable regulations. This Variance will terminate without notice upon sale of the subject property.

A variance application letter (as noted below in PART III) MUST specifically address each of the following issues:

1. There must be circumstances or conditions which are unique to the applicant, and do not generally affect other persons subject to the regulation. Please indicate how your request is unique to your situation and is, therefore, not likely to affect other persons subject to specific regulation: This request is unique because the waterfall was on the original plans submitted to the SNHD in 1989 and has been in place since August 24, 1988.
2. There must be circumstances or conditions which make compliance with the regulation unduly burdensome and cause a hardship to and abridge a substantial property right of the applicant, and the variance is necessary to render substantial justice to and preserve the property rights of the applicant. Plense indicate in what manner compliance with the regulation would be burdensome or cause a hardship on your business or how the free use of your property may be affected (if economic factor are an issue, plense include estimates regarding the costs that would incurred by compliance): The waterfall is the focal point of the clubicuse and the entire resert and is used in advertising and marketing collateral throughout the company. Removal would have a significant impact on the resert activities program and negatively affect revenue from our food & baverage outlets. Removal of the waterfall feature would require very substantial and costly renovation and modification to an existing and long standing pool and pool deck, which was permitted and approved over 23 years ago.
3. Granting the variance will not be detrimental or pose a danger to public health and safety. Please provide evidence that the variance request, if approved, will not adversely affect the safe and saultary operation of the applicant(s) pool, spa, or food establishment: The resert, including the pool areas, are patrolled 2417 by the resert security team. There is no swimming area on the opposite side of the waterfell from the pool, only an area for sunbathing and relaxing. The waterfall feature has been in place in it's current configuration for over 23 years without incident. There is very ample space on all sides of the water feature.

- The state board of health will grant a variance from a regulation only if it finds from the evidence presented at the hearing that:
 - (a) There are circumstances or conditions which:
 - (1) Are unique to the applicant;
 - (2) Do not generally affect other persons subject to the regulation;
 - (3) Make compliance with the regulation unduly burdensome; and
 - (4) Cause a hardship to and abridge a substantial property right of the applicant; and
 - (b) Granting the variance:
- (1) Is necessary to render substantial justice to the applicant and enable him to preserve and enjoy his property right; and
 - (2) Will not be detrimental or pose a danger to public health and safety.
- 2. Whenever an applicant for a variance alleges that he suffers or will suffer economic hardship by complying with the regulations, he must submit evidence demonstrating the costs of his compliance with the regulation. ALL information you have provided in PART I and II of this Worksheet must be included in the body of the letter. The evidence required may include 8%° x 11° or 11° x 17° detailed drawings and/or photographs.

The Variance process is outlined in Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 439.260 through 439.260 with the exception that an application fee is payable to SOUTHERN NEVADA HEALTH DISTRICT (SNHD).

Variance Application Letter/Request for Variance from Nevada Administrative Code section 444.134(1)-Pool Deck Obstruction

Dear Mr. Savage:

Please accept this letter, together with the Variance Candidate worksheet and Site Plans for the referenced Project's Pool Number 1 (the "Pool"), as the request of the Owner for a variance from Nevada Administrative Code section 444.134(1) requiring that a pool deck remain unobstructed or, in the alternative, be obstructed for a distance of no more than ten percent (10%) of the perimeter of the Pool. Please note that the Owner is not the original developer but instead purchased the Project from Desert Club, LLC in 2011.

Specifically, the variance application is to grant a condition that the current waterfall structure at the perimeter of the Pool be allowed to remain in its current state and not be removed or re-sized, notwithstanding the fact that it obstructs roughly twenty-three percent (23%) of the perimeter of the Pool deck. This is because the current waterfall structure is depicted on the Site Plans which the original developer submitted to the South Nevada Health District ("SNHD") on July 20, 1989 and which were subsequently approved. Removal of the structure would be very costly and would cause an undue burden on the Owner.

Please note that the address of the Project is 3950 Koval Lane, Las Vegas, Nevada 89109. The Parcel Identification Number is 162-16-801-001. The Owner is also the operator of the Project and its physical and business address is 8505 West Irlo Bronson Memorial Highway, Kissimmee, Florida 34747. The contact person for the Owner is Adalberto Lugo, the General Manager of the Project. He is located at the

Project and his office phone number is (702) 866-4001 and his mobile number is (702) 521-1378.

Per the original site plans submitted to and approved by the SNHD, the waterfall structure obstructs approximately twenty-three percent (23%) of the perimeter of the Pool. The waterfall structure has been in place and in its current configuration since construction of the Pool in 1989, all without issue. It has not and will not create any additional hazard. Additionally, it was the original developer, and not the Owner, who constructed the waterfall structure and said structure was in place in 2011 when the Owner purchased the Project. Owner has no plans to construct any additional structures at the perimeter of the Pool, which means that the remaining seventy-seven (77%) of the perimeter of the Pool will remain unobstructed.

The following lists the conditions, circumstances and issues that support granting a variance to the Project:

EVIDENCE SUBMITTED FOR GRANTING A VARIANCE

The evidence submitted for granting a variance to permit Las Vegas Desert Club to deviate from Nevada Administrative Code section 444.134 by allowing Owner to maintain the current waterfall structure at the perimeter of the Pool notwithstanding the fact that it obstructs roughly twenty-three percent (23%) of the said perimeter is as follows:

A. There are circumstances or conditions which:

- Are unique to the applicant: A unique condition exists at the Project because the waterfall structure was part of the site plan which the SNHD approved in 1989. The waterfall structure was approved notwithstanding the fact that it obstructs twenty-three percent (23%) of the perimeter of the Pool.
- Do not generally affect other persons subject to the Regulation: This
 condition does not generally affect other persons subject to the regulation
 as the design of the Pool and Pool deck do comply with the requirements
 of Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 444 except as requested herein.
- Make compliance with the Regulation unduly burdensome: Compliance with the Regulation would be unduly burdensome for Las Vegas Desert Club as the waterfall structure would have to be removed in its entirety, which would necessitate destruction and reconfiguration of the long

existing Pool deck as well as the perimeter of the Pool, reconstruction of the same and temporary closure of the Pool and adjacent Restaurant until such destruction and reconstruction are completed, all at an exorbitant cost.

B. Hardships caused and substantial property rights abridged by complying with the Regulation: Compliance with the Regulation would cause Owner to temporarily close the Pool for approximately one (1) month, which would negatively affect the experience of the Project's guests, negatively impact those guests' activities (such as swimming, sunbathing and other vacation-related activities) and negatively affect both the Owner's and the Las Vegas Resort Owners Association's (the "Association") revenue from the Prospector Joe's Gold Mine Bar and Grill (the "Restaurant"). The Restaurant is located just off of the Pool deck and depends in large part on Pool quests in order to generate revenue. Accordingly, the lower the volume of guests (the decreased volume of guests would be a direct result of the closing the Pool), the greater the loss in revenue. Due to this loss in revenue, it is likely that the Owner would close the Restaurant while the Pool is closed. If Owner were to close the Restaurant for one (1) month, the Owner and the Association would lose approximately \$140,000.00 in revenue.

In addition to the above, demolishing the waterfall structure and rebuilding the Pool deck would cost roughly \$20,000.00.

Furthermore, the waterfall structure is also an important, high profile structure and the focal point of the adjoining clubhouse area. It is an identifying feature of the Project and is used in Owner's advertising and marketing materials. Removing the waterfall structure would require Owner to revise said materials and would cause the clubhouse area to lose its focal point and the Project to lose its identifying feature.

Lastly, the Project is a timeshare resort and the guest's experience is the determining factor in whether he or she cares to do business with the Owner. A poor experience would likely cause a guest not to do business with the Owner, which in turn would cause Owner to lose credibility and to lose a vital source of revenue.

C. Granting the variance is necessary to render substantial justice to the Owner and to enable its preservation and enjoyment of a property right: Granting the variance will allow the Project's guests to enjoy continued, uninterrupted use of the Pool and the Pool deck for swimming, sunbathing

and conducting other vacation-related activities, all while enjoying the high aesthetic value of the waterfall structure. Granting the variance will also allow the Owner continued use of the waterfall structure as its identifying feature and as a focal point in marketing materials.

D. Granting the variance would not be detrimental or pose a danger to public health and safety: The waterfall structure has existed in its current state since 1989, with no issues. There is no swimming area on the back side of the waterfall structure and the Pool is clearly visible from all sides of the waterfall structure. Finally, the Pool area is monitored twenty-four (24) hoursa-day by the Project's own security staff.


