Education, Work History and Partial Public Service Resume

Kenneth Osgood, MD, MPH, a Board Certified Pediatrician, is President of Medical Scientific Resources of Nevada, Inc. His current practice is limited to preventive health and biometric testing services.

Dr. Osgood received his undergraduate degree from the University of California, Riverside; his medical degree from the University of Cincinnati, and his master degree in Health and Hospital Administration from the UCLA School of Public Health. He completed his internship, residency and National Institute of Health Infectious Disease fellowship at the Los Angeles County/University of Southern California Medical Center and his applied epidemiology and biostatistics training at the National Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, Georgia. From 1978 until his relocation to Nevada in 1994, he was a Clinical Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of New Mexico, School of Medicine.

While in private practice in New Mexico he served as Chief of Staff and member of the local hospital Board of Trustees. In the late 1980s, he began a physician executive career and served as the regional Medical and/or Plan Director for EQUICOR, CIGNA, FHP and United HealthCare. Also, he was the first Medical Director/Clinical Coordinator for the New Mexico Medical Review Association implementing the CMS Health Care Quality Improvement Initiative, and served as the western region Medical Director of SDMS, a national disease management firm.

He served in the Indian Health Service at Tuba City, Arizona. During that time he published a report documenting the severe infant malnutrition he and his colleagues were observing. Subsequently, Congress reviewed his report and created the national Food Stamp (SNAP) and Women, Infants and Children Supplemental Nutrition (WIC) programs incorporating his recommendations.

During his National Institute of Health Infectious Disease fellowship he created a nurse supervised systematic inpatient infection control program which was adopted by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals as an accreditation standard.

During his years in private practice in rural northern New Mexico, he and his colleagues implemented health delivery system changes, including successfully lobbying for state legislative initiatives creating the nation's first comprehensive state wide neonatal transport and delivery system. This resulted in the regional reduction of neonatal deaths from 30 deaths per 1000 live births per year to less than 2 deaths per 1000 live births per year within 2 years. He and his partner also implemented a systematic comprehensive pediatric preventive disease practice program resulting in the region's annual pediatric inpatient admissions per 1000 falling from 70 to 16; annual pediatric inpatient days per 1000 falling from 178 to 73; and emergency room use reduction falling from 5000 pediatric visits per year to less than 500.

Dr. Osgood served as president of the New Mexico Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and also served on the AAP Council and AAP National Child Health Finance Committee. During his tenure on that committee he chaired a subcommittee that designed a supplemental children's insurance program, a program presented to Congress and ultimately adopted. The program is referred to as the State Children's Health Insurance Plan (SCHIP).

He also participated in the HealthCare Summit; a national forum that issued a report entitled "Guiding Principles to Protect and Improve the Health Status of All Americans". The report and eight federal reform proposals, released in 2009, was presented to Congress. Most of the proposals were endorsed by Congress and incorporated into the Accountable Care Acts, signed into law in 2010.

Dr. Osgood has provided expert testimony to Congress on issues of child health systems and finance; to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) on Medicaid regulations; to the New Mexico Senate Finance and Corporations Committees on health care issues and to the Nevada Legislature's Health Committee. Most recently he served a term on the Southern Nevada Health District Board of Health. He currently serves on the Nevada Governor's Food Security Council.

For fourteen years, I served as the Senior Director, of the Nevada tobacco Users' Helpline at the University of Nevada School of Medicine, Las Vegas, NV. I collaboratively developed the Nevada Tobacco User's and Helpline (NTUH) programs; Brief Intervention for Problem Gambling Line; Brief Intervention for Health Care Professionals, Wellness Integrated Recovery, Nicotine Addiction Treatment Program and Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention program components. I designed patients' and community interventions based on evidence-based practice. I developed evaluation methods for programs for patients, healthcare systems, and the community. In addition, I supervised the development of data bases for collection of evaluation data outcomes. I was in chage of program evaluation of all NTUH projects. Collaborating with the NTUH support team we developed the TQI program to assure consistency and quality of information, education, and treatment. I directed and supervised the development and dissemination of program reports for state and federal funding agencies. I used transformational leadership to develop a culture leading to high employee retention rates.

My health policy contribution centers on decreasing the impact of tobacco use in Nevada and in the Philippines. This has been my life-long work. Way back in 1997, when the quitlines in the US were only in California and Washington, I saw the need to advocate for the needs of tobacco users, their families, the professionals who cared for them and the community they lived in. Therefore to assure access to services for these populations, I founded the Nevada Tobacco Users Helpline (NTUH). Nineteen years and over 40,000 clients later, the quitline still provides nicotine dependence treatment.

The NTUH program I designed was evidence-based, holistic and intensive which required interprofessional collaboration. Quit rates were above the national average. I brought over \$10,000,000 in federal and state funding for NTUH.

Because of this advocacy, the Governor of Nevada appointed me for eight years to sit on a taskforce to oversee the distribution of the tobacco master settlement dollars. In collaboration with tobacco control advocates and with my knowledge of comprehensive tobacco control, advocacy, interprofessional relationship dynamics, Nevada was able create a comprehensive tobacco control program .

My passion for policy work allowed me to help 11 Las Vegas hospitals become tobacco-free. I shared with administration and staff evidence-based practices, consulted on institutional policy development and conducted staff training. I worked with 50 accountable care organizations, 16 federally qualified health centers and state and local county health departments to create tobacco use polices during routine patient care.

In 2012, I started working with then Philippine Secretary of Health to create a national quitline in the Philippines. I advocated for access to services on behalf of Filipinos who smoke. I am now collaborating with the Medical director of Philippine Lung Center (PLC). Progress includes comprehensively addressing tobacco use at PLC and the Tobacco Cessation Clinic remains in place. In collaboration with private advocacy groups, I was able to publish in a Philippine newspaper, with a circulation of over three million my articles for smoking cessation in a series covering the physical, mental emotional and spiritual essentials for nicotine addiction recovery.

In addition, I am working with Philippine health care and nursing school leaders to plan the dissemination of brief intervention for addressing tobacco use. In collaboration with the Western Visayan Region Nurses Association, I integrated evidence-based interventions in a ready to use tool to facilitate addressing tobacco use in twenty-five schools and three healthcare organizations. We are continuing to work together to address implementation opportunities with plans to expand to more schools and organizations. The structure and relationships created from this work is intended to create a seamless process of disseminating evidence-based practice information among nursing schools in the Philippines.

In 2015, I started working with US nursing programs to emphasize the importance of the role of nurses in comprehensive tobacco control programs at the local, state, national and international levels. I advocated for the integration of brief interventions for tobacco use. I provided resources and technical assistance to school administration and faculty responsible for redesigning courses. As a result of this work, smoking cessation is being introduced as a major intervention in supporting health and preventing illness in 21 undergraduate nursing, one RN to BSN, and one FNP programs.

During my term at Vice-President of the Nevada Nurses Association, we were able to pass our safe staffing and independent practice legislation in 2015. The NNA worked with numerous organizations to make both legislation a reality. We are currently working with the Nevada Hospital Association and the Nevada State Board of Nursing to educate nurses on the safe staffing bill.






