That the Southern Nevada District Board of Health supports the efforts of the Southern Nevada Health District to become an accredited public health agency.

DISCUSSION:

The Southern Nevada Health District is applying for accreditation from the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB). Written support from the governing entity is required for a PHAB accreditation application. The Health District opened up the application process on September 19, 2016 and must complete the application process by March 2017. The Board's responsibilities include approving resources, providing a point of accountability for the agency, receiving reports, and playing a key role in accreditation activities and efforts.

FUNDING:

Public health accreditation fees are based on the jurisdictional population served by the Health District. The initial accreditation fee is \$35,000. The annual accreditation fee is \$14,000.
