RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

The Reminder program provided 432 successful reminder calls for adults 65 years and older via telephonic calls and postcards for individuals with no doses of Prevnar, Pneumovax, shingles and/or TD/Tdap vaccines on December 15, 2017. There were 85 successful reminder calls for children 19-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations.

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

- 1. Two Mobile Unit Clinics were held at Skyview YMCA and Windmill Library with 2 clients receiving 6 vaccinations.
- 2. Harm Reduction Health Fair was held at Chuck Minker Community Center with 4 clients receiving 7 vaccinations.
- 3. Adult Clinic for uninsured clients was held at the Mexican Consulate with 29 clients receiving 61 vaccinations.
- 4. Hepatitis A Campaign clinic for the homeless was held where 12 clients received 39 vaccinations.
- 5. Hepatitis A Campaign provided a Hepatitis A Prevention Presentation to the Nevada Homeless Alliance meeting.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

- 1. There was no new childhood lead poisoning case reported during the month of December.
- 2. There were three referrals from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.
- 3. The Maternal Child Health Nurse continues working with the Division of Community Health to identify and potentially provide case management services to infants with Zika Syndrome in the greater Las Vegas area.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 160 active clients. 57 are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV)

Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

In 2017, the NFP program served 1293 first time mothers, an average of 107 clients per month. The seven nurse home visitors completed 2,162 home visits. Thirty-three infants were born into the program. Four mothers delivered without prenatal care.

C. Healthy Start Initiative (HSI)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start program has enrolled 572 at risk participants since March 2015, when enrollment began. 150 infants have been born into the program since March 2015. At present, four case managers and team lead are serving 276 participants total.

The SNHD's Healthy Start Initiative (HSI) team has continued ongoing activities to support families in meeting project goals to improve women's health, increase access to quality services, strengthen families' resilience, achieve collective impact and monitor performance/outcomes. Outreach this month included: Lullaby Connections, Department of Family Services, Southern Nevada Housing Authority, and Baby's Bounty.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A. The HIV Case Management (MCM) program served 94 unduplicated clients during the month of December. Three pregnant women were referred to the program and one infant was born with perinatal HIV exposure. Exposed newborns and infants are followed by case management nurses for periodic HIV testing until cleared at approximately four months of age.
- B. Community Health Workers (CHW) and program supervisor attended a mandatory training in Boston for the grant-funded CHW program. The team presented on current status of CHW in SNHD. One staff attended training on data reporting through the RWPA grant recipient. Two staff participated in the revision of RWPA Standard of Care for case management and Outpatient Ambulatory Health Services.
- C. Nurse Case Management (NCM) continues to collaborate with the UNLV Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs to provide case management and care coordination for perinatally exposed newborns and children living with HIV. NCM and UNLV partnered to provide information about reporting or births to women who have been diagnosed with HIV and have completed the presentations to nine area birthing hospitals.
- D. The program Senior CHN retired and recruitment is in progress for this position. The program is recruiting two new Community Health Nurses (CHN) for the RW Part B case management program.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (STD Care Services)

A. Direct Nursing services were provided to 888 clients at this clinic. Two new APRN's have completed their training in SHC and are independently seeing patients. A new laboratory assistant started this month.

- B. Training of clinic team members to implement Expedited Partner Therapy (EPT) was completed this month. EPT is to start on January 2018, in collaboration with the Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance (OEDS).
- C. SHC is working to improve collaboration with OEDS and HIV Ryan White services. Monthly meetings with senior staff from these services are already in place, and initiated. The goal is to bridge gaps and increase efficiencies.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. Five active adult cases and no new pediatric cases were reported to the TB Clinic.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 37 clients (31 Adult and 16 pediatric). 74 percent of these adult clients (23 out of 31) required communicable disease follow-up. A refugee health assessment service for refugee children was initiated at this clinic.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community based organizations in the community.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events include; TPP program conducted outreach activities at Las Vegas HS, Sunrise HS, Dessert Pines HS, Rancho HS and El Dorado HS. In addition, TPP conducted two presentations at the Goodwill youth work development program. TPP provided information and resources to 581 individuals.
- C. During December, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THNKnevada Facebook page achieved a total of 17 new likes and 3,440 individuals were engaged in it. The twitter account reached 695 followers and had 799 impressions. The THNK website had 93 unique users, 61 new users and 9 returning users and the Instagram page reached 630 followers and 28 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served a total of 618 clients; 589 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 343 clients (330 unduplicated clients).
- C. The Decatur family planning clinic served 275 clients (259 unduplicated clients).

VIII. Family Health Clinic

A. Initiated Family Health Clinic on December 1, 2017. This clinic is offering school, college, university, employment physicals and children preventive health services every Friday from 8:00am to 3:30 pm. There were 16 clients seen during the month of December.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 139 prescriptions for 95 clients.
- B. Assessed/counseled 29 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Assisted 15 clients to obtain medication financial assistance.
- D. Referred one client to community partners for additional services.
- E. Obtained no-cost oral contraceptives to supply 254 clients for one year.

V. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Chamberlain, Nevada State College, Roseman University and Touro University and University of Nevada School of Medicine had scheduled SNHD Clinical Services rotations.
- B. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were 8.5 CEU's offered in December.
