Medical Miles for Rural Smiles

From April 9-11th the Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) in partnership with the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division Public and Behavioral Health(DPBH) - Oral Health Program (OHP) visited Tonopah, Goldfield, and Pahrump in a combined effort to provide much needed dental services and immunizations to rural communities in Southern Nevada. The team consisted of Antonina Capurro, DMD,MPH,MBA, Nevada State Dental Health Officer, Jessica Woods, RDH, Public Health Dental Hygienist, Sarah Lugo, MSN, RN, Senior Community Health Nurse, and Lizette Enzenauer, Administrative Assistant II.

The trip successfully delivered 115 preventive dental sealants, 51 fluoride varnishes, 52 dental screenings, oral cancer screenings, oral health and nutritional information, Medicaid enrollment paperwork, and oral hygiene supplies. In addition, 33 immunizations were provided to 21 clients.

The program will continue through the summer with two future trips planned through White Pine, Nye, and Esmeralda Counties. After a strong program launch, the partners envision expanding the number and types of services and intend to broaden established service areas.

It is the program's hope that this charter trip will be used as proof of concept to establish funding sources for permanent continuation as well as recruitment of additional licensed dental and medical staff.
