RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. There were 61 successful calls and postcards sent out to adults 65 years and older who did not receive their doses of Prevenar, Pneumovax and/or Td/Tdap vaccinations.
2. There were 127 reminder calls sent to parents of children 19-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations in June.
3. Due to the recent U.S. Measles Outbreaks from January 2019 through June 2019, an increase of 1,265 doses of MMR and MMRV vaccine were given to clients that came into the SNHD Immunization Clinic. A total of 4,972 of vaccines were administered.
4. There has been a noticeable influx of clients coming in for travel vaccines from January 2019 to June 30, 2019 compared to previous years. SNHD Immunization Clinic to date has seen 1,829 clients for travel vaccines compared to last year's number of 1,355 clients. In June 387 clients received travel vaccines.
5. An Adolescent Clinic in partnership with Immunize Nevada and Healthy Young NV was held at the Main Immunization Clinic on June 6, 2019. There were 227 vaccines provided to 86 adolescents.
6. "Don't Wait to Vaccinate" vouchers, sponsored by Immunize Nevada, encourage parents and/or guardians to vaccinate their school-age children in June instead of waiting until Back to School in August. There were 188 vouchers redeemed.
7. The first Back to School planning meeting with key players was held on June 11, 2019 with 28 attendees.
8. Flu season ended June 30, 2019 with a total of 10,524 doses of flu vaccines administered during the 2018-2019 flu season.

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

1. Homeless Outreach Immunization Clinics
 - a. Trac B Exchange on June 6, 2019, no clients were seen.
 - b. Shannon West Homeless Youth Center on June 11, 2019, no clients were seen.
 - c. Clinic at the tunnels with Aids Health Foundation on June 25, 2019, administered 14 vaccines to 7 clients.
 - d. Conference call with Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance (OEDS) and other community partners on June 24, 2019 to discuss Hepatitis A among the homeless and at-risk populations.
 - e. Downtown Outreach on June 13, 2019, administered 8 vaccines to 4 clients.

- f. Mexican Consulate on June 17, 2019 administered 39 vaccines to 15 clients.
- g. Windmill Library in partnership with Immunize Nevada, as part of the Healthy Young Nevada grant administered 9 vaccines to 4 clients.
- h. World Refugee Day in partnership with Catholic Charities administered 16 vaccines to 6 clients.
- i. Valley View Rec Center on June 25, 2019, 4 clients seen, 3 had current Immunization records and 1 client refused vaccinations.
- j. Clark County Library, in partnership with Immunize Nevada and the Healthy Young Nevada grant administered 39 vaccines to 14 clients.
- k. The SNHD Employee Health Nurse and Immunization Clinic administered 87 vaccines to 47 employees on June 4, 2019.
- l. Staff support was provided to Immunization Clinic on June 6, 2019, to assist in the Adolescent Clinic.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

1. There were no new reported cases of childhood lead poisoning in June.
2. There were no referrals from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 187 active clients. Forty-eight are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The program hosted a successful site visit from the Nevada Department of Health and Human Service's Nevada Home Visiting Program on June 19, 2019.

C. Healthy Start Initiative (HSI), Closed June 30th, 2019, end of federal grant, not renewed

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start program has enrolled 763 at risk participants since March 2015, when enrollment began. Two hundred and twelve infants were born into the program since March 2015. On June 30, 2019, the program closed and is no longer enrolling new participants. The required federal project Impact Report was completed and submitted during June 2019. Work on the required Federal Performance Report occurred during June 2019.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A. The HIV/Medical Case Management (MCM) program received 24 referrals in June. Three newborns with perinatal HIV exposure were referred to MCM. Newborns perinatally exposed to HIV are followed for periodic testing for approximately four months to determine their HIV status. The MCM team provides on-call coverage for hospitals reporting births to women presenting in labor and have a known HIV diagnosis or a reactive test for HIV during the admission. The team continues to collaborate with the UNLV Maternal Child Wellness program to provide case management and care coordination for perinatally exposed newborns and children living with HIV. Plans are under way with UNLV to provide the annual HIV trainings to area birthing hospitals. This year, trainings will include Syphilis and Hepatitis B as a joint effort with Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance, Immunization Project's Perinatal Hep B program and the Nevada State Department of Behavioral Health.

- B. The Ryan White Clinic continues to collaborate with the Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance (OEDS) and the State of Nevada Office of HIV/AIDS with the early initiation of antiretroviral therapy to newly diagnosed HIV-positive clients. The project has seen 11 new eligible clients in the month of June. The Clinical Pharmacist is an integral part of the project as clients ideally leave the clinic with medications the same day.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (STD Care Services)

- A. The Sexual Health Clinic (SHC) completed 1,312 service encounters.
- B. The Sexual Health Clinic continues to refer clients for rapid start HIV treatment upon receipt of confirmed HIV positive results. Plans include efforts to increase rapid HIV testing services with STD screening. HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and Hepatitis infection treatment services continue to be offered in the Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Collaboration efforts continue with Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance to provide follow-up and clinic management of patients discharged from Clark County Detention Center who tested positive for the Hepatitis infection.
- D. The Sexual Health Clinic Offered free HIV testing to the community for the National HIV Testing Day. Twenty-eight clients participated in this event.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. Two new active adult TB cases were reported, one adult active TB case transferred from California during this this period. There were no new pediatric TB cases.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 34 adults in June.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community-based organizations in the community.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: On June 6, 2019, TPP in collaboration with the Family Planning Clinic carried out a Youth Access Day. On June 28, 2019, TPP participated in the Latino Youth Conference held at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. TPP provided information and resources to 100 individuals.
- C. During June, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THNKnevada Facebook page has a total of 5,949 likes. The twitter account has 724 followers and had 1,546 impressions. The THNK website had 126 unique pageviews, 72 new users and 8 returning users and the Instagram page reached 885 followers and 163 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served 500 clients, 461 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 218 clients, 207 of them were unduplicated.

C. The Decatur Family Planning clinic served 282 clients, 254 of them were unduplicated.

VIII. Family Health Clinic

A. The Family Health Care Clinic saw 119 patients in the month of June. Eighteen patients were age 18 or younger and includes 8 children from the Refugee Clinic. There were 101 patients age 19 or older. Immunizations were offered to those in need, according to the ACIP recommended Immunization Schedule.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 474 prescriptions for 382 clients.
- A. Assessed/counseled 15 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- B. Assessed/counseled 28 clients in the Tuberculosis Clinic.
- C. Assisted 40 clients to obtain medication financial assistance.
- D. Assisted 8 clients with insurance approvals.
- E. Referred zero clients to community partners.

X. Clinical Services Administration

A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in June.
