RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

- 1. There were 104 reminder calls sent out to parents of children 19-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations in the month of July.
- 2. There were 62 successful reminder calls and postcards that were sent out for children 6 weeks through 4 years without appropriate number of Prevnar doses.
- 3. Annual Back to School Immunization training was provided to staff. Nurses who attended the training received 1.5 CEUs.

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

- 1. In response to the Hepatitis A Outbreak among the at-risk populations (homeless and drug users), Hepatitis A Outbreak Strike team clinics have been initiated. Community partnerships with HELP of Southern Nevada, Courtyard, Westcare, Clark County Detention Center (CCSD), Nevada Homeless Alliance, Aids Health Foundation and Catholic Charities have been very productive. Three Hepatitis A Clinics have been conducted each week in addition to the monthly regular scheduled outreach clinics. For this month a total of 365 clients received immunization outreach services. Five hundred and forty-five vaccines were administered including 309 Hepatitis A adult doses.
- 2. Other Outreach Immunization Clinics
 - a. Downtown Outreach Clinic held on July 11, 2019, provided 6 vaccines to 2 clients and review of 5 client records.
 - b. Mexican Consulate Clinic held on July 15, 2019, provided 26 vaccines to 20 clients.
 - c. Windmill Library Clinic held on July 17, 2019, provided 15 vaccines to 5 clients.
 - d. Valley View Rec Center Clinic held on July 23, 2019, provided 8 vaccines to 2 clients.
 - e. Clark County Library Clinic held on July 24, 2019, provided 13 vaccines to 6 clients.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

- 1. There were two new reported cases of childhood lead poisoning in July.
- 2. There were two referrals from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 175 active clients. 48 are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The program is preparing to attend the Nevada Home Visiting Statewide Meeting in August 2019.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A. The HIV/Medical Case Management (MCM) program received 41 referrals in July. One newborn with perinatal HIV exposure was referred to MCM. Newborns perinatally exposed to HIV are followed for periodic testing for approximately four months to determine their HIV status.
- B. The program hired a Community Health Worker (CHW). The CHW position will be partially funded by Boston University and Nevada State for Transitional Case Management prisons pilot project. This workforce member will facilitate the discharge planning and linkage to care of inmates from all the prisons in the south. Training and orientation are ongoing.
- C. The Ryan White clinic continues to implement the Rapid Start project which has a goal of rapid treatment initiation for patients newly diagnosed with HIV. A total of 74 eligible clients have participated on this project since its inception last April 2019. This is a collaborative effort between the SNHD Divisions of Clinical Services, and Community Health (OEDS), as well as the Nevada State Ryan White Part B and Clark County Ryan White Part A program.
- D. The CHW team presented at "Grupo de Apoyo" at Community Outreach Medical Center. This was a Spanish speaking only audience where the CHW's presentation addressed issues related to patient perspectives on living with HIV, what's new at SNHD and PrEP 101. Six attendees participated on this first session.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (STD Care Services)

- A. The Sexual Health Clinic (SHC) completed 1654 service encounters.
- B. The Sexual Health Clinic continues to refer clients for rapid start HIV treatment upon receipt of confirmed HIV positive results. Rapid HIV testing services are being offered to high risk clients with STD screening. HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and Hepatitis C infection treatment services continue to be offered in the Sexual Health Clinic. Same-day start for PrEP services is also offered at this clinic.
- C. The new SNHD Clinic Supervisor started this month. The position will focus on administrative/operational aspects of the clinic including patient registration, clinic flow, customer service, data collection for billing purposes and patient's support (e.g. insurance verification, forms completion, demographic information, etc.) to improve the flow at the front desk and the clinic.
- D. Three new medical assistants filled vacant positions.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

A. Five new active adult TB cases were reported by the TB Clinic during this period. There were no new pediatric TB cases.

B. The Refugee Health Program served 58 adults in July.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and community partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community-based organizations.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: No special projects or events to report.
- C. During July, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THNKnevada Facebook page has a total of 5,926 likes. The twitter account has 728 followers and had 2,363 impressions. The THNK website had 161 unique pageviews, 87 new users and 15 returning users and the Instagram page reached 887 followers and 410 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served 519 clients; 514 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 261 clients; 261 of them were unduplicated.
- C. The Decatur Family Planning clinic served 258 clients; 253 of them were unduplicated.

VIII. Family Health Clinic

A. The Family Health Care Clinic saw 214 patients in the month of July. Seventy-two patients were age 18 or younger and includes 11 children from the Refugee Clinic. One hundred and forty-two patients were age 19 or older. Immunizations were offered to those in need, according to the ACIP recommended Immunization Schedule.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 533 prescriptions for 436 clients.
- B. Assessed/counseled 19 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Assessed/counseled 36 clients in the Tuberculosis Clinic.
- D. Assisted 59 clients to obtain medication financial assistance.
- E. Assisted 13 clients with insurance approvals.

X. Clinical Services Administration

A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were 6 CEU's offered in July.
