RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

- 1. Due to COVID 19, Immunization services were available by appointments through the month of May at all clinic locations.
- The team continued to make reminder calls to children 0-47 months of age who were behind on ACIP recommended vaccines for the month of May. More than 200 calls were made. Children without a primary care provider were offer an appointment to be vaccinated at the Health District.
- Reminder calls were made to individuals who were not complete with their Human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV) series. Education was provided on the importance of series completion. More than 600 calls were made in May. Individuals without a medical home were offered an appointment to complete his/her HPV series.

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

- 1. Outreach Immunization clinics have been suspended due to the current COVID 19 situation. Staff have been supporting other clinic departments FQHC, SNHD lab, screening staff and clients, and ICS Community activities.
- 2. Staff attended Strike team PPE training on May 2, 2020, in preparation for COVID testing.
- 3. Staff participated in community wide COVID testing at Allegiant Stadium, Laughlin, Fiesta Casino, Sam's Town, and Suncoast. Staff also supported COVID testing at targeted settings in nursing homes, skilled nursing facilities, encampments, and shelters.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

- 1. There were no new reported childhood lead cases for the month of May.
- 2. There were four referrals from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 170 active clients served by seven nurse home visitors. 50 clients are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

This is a challenging time for NFP families especially those with limited resources and support. The program continues to provide information, guidance, support and resources to clients using telehealth on a regular basis. The interviews to replace one nurse home visitor rescheduled for May were again rescheduled for June.

C. Embracing Healthy Baby

The Southern Nevada Health District's Embracing Healthy Baby program continues to develop. Ongoing training on maternal child health topics continues. A CHW was hired, started May 4, 2020 and is currently in orientation. The CHW's start date was delayed due to the shifting of resources to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak. The trained CHW is managing cases with minimal guidance from the program Community Health Nurse. Telephone visits are currently being conducted with enrolled families. Education and referrals to needed services continue to be provided to families. There was no Program Outreach during the month of May due to community agency closures or shift to remote work.

III. Tuberculosis Clinic

- A. Four new active adult TB cases were reported by the TB Clinic during this period. There were no new pediatric cases.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served one adult in May.

IV. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community-based organizations.
- B. Due to the COViD-19 pandemic and restrictions imposed by the program site partners and by the State's Governor program activities have been placed on hold.

V. Clinical Services Administration

A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in May.
