SUBJECT: Chief Health Officer Report

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

On December 14, the Southern Nevada Health District received the community's first doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The initial shipment of 12,675 doses of vaccine were delivered to hospitals to be administered to health care personnel. The initial doses of the vaccine were distributed using a tiered approach to ensure the supplies of vaccine provided were enough to vaccinate the critical populations identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.

The Health District's distribution plan mirrored the CDC's recommendations and the Nevada Division of Health and Human Services Vaccination Program Playbook. These recommendations and plans have since been updated and will allow local health authorities more flexibility to simultaneously offer vaccine to priority groups and expedite vaccine delivery.

Influenza Season

The Southern Nevada Health District's Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance began its 2020-2021 influenza season surveillance activities on Sept. 27, 2020 and continues through May 22, 2021. Surveillance reports are distributed throughout the season and available on the Health District website at www.southernnevadahealthdistrict.org/news-info/statistics-surveillance-reports/influenza-surveillance/.

The first flu-related death of the season was reported in a woman who was over the age of 65. Influenza activity has remained low in Clark County compared to past seasons, but this death serves as a reminder that the flu is a serious disease and is still circulating in the community. As of January 2, 10 people in Clark County have been hospitalized with confirmed diagnosis of flu, an increase of five cases from the previous week. The percentage of emergency room and urgent care clinic visits for influenza-like-illness (ILI) in Clark County was 3.2 percent for the week ending January 2, which was higher than the previous week (2.6 percent).

The Health District continues to encourage everyone to get vaccinated against the flu this season to help ensure medical resources are conserved and the health care system is not overtaxed as the response to the COVID-19 pandemic continues. The flu vaccine is

recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older. It is especially important for those at higher risk of developing serious complications from the flu. Many of the people at higher risk of complications from the flu are also at higher risk of complications from COVID-19. World AIDS Day

The Southern Nevada Health District commemorated the 32nd World AIDS Day on December 1 with the launch of its Collect2Protect online HIV/STD at-home testing program. This innovative program is part of its efforts to enhance HIV/STD services offered in Clark County. People interested in getting tested for HIV can visit the Collect2Protect website at www.snhd.info/c2p to order a test kit. The at-home HIV kits are free and allow individuals to receive their results in their home. At-home test kits for gonorrhea and chlamydia are also available.

Since World AIDS Day 2019, Nevada received an Ending the HIV Epidemic grant due to its continued increase in new HIV diagnoses and the number of people living with HIV. In Clark County, there are approximately 10,100 people living with HIV and 448 of them were newly diagnosed. As part of this funding, the Health District is focusing on four areas with efforts to:

- Diagnose all people with HIV as early as possible.
- Treat people with HIV rapidly and effectively to reach sustained viral suppression.
- **Prevent** new HIV transmissions by using proven interventions, including preexposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and syringe services programs (SSPs).
- **Respond** quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get prevention and treatment services to people who need them.

The Health District encourages everyone to get tested and to learn their HIV status. Early diagnosis is critical for people with HIV so that they can benefit from antiretroviral therapy (ART). ART reduces HIV levels in the bloodstream, reduces HIV-related illnesses, and lowers the risk of transmitting HIV to intimate partners. With ART, HIV-positive people can remain healthy for many years.

People who get tested and learn they are HIV negative can make decisions about their risk factors and health care. Those who are at high risk for HIV infection can discuss pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) with their health care providers to reduce their risk of infection.
