RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Main clinic continues to be a COVID-19 mass vaccination site in the month of February. A total of 6,180 doses of Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines were administered at this site.
2. The immunization team continues to support receiving and distributing of COVID-19 vaccines to hospitals and community partners. A total of 114,660 doses of Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine and 54,600 doses of Moderna vaccine (total of 169,260 doses) received in the month of February.
3. The East Las Vegas and Mesquite Immunization clinics continue to provide routine vaccines to the public by appointment only. East Las Vegas Immunization Clinic saw an influx of clients coming in for routine vaccination due to the temporarily closure of the Main and Henderson Immunization Clinics to support COVID-19 mass vaccination efforts.
4. There were 51 reminder calls made to parents/guardians of children 2-35 months who are not up to date with their immunization in the month of February

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

1. A Flu clinic at Mater Academy- 3900 East Bonanza Rd Las Vegas, 89119 was held on Saturday, 2/6/21. There were 17 adults and 4 children who received the flu vaccine at no cost.
2. Staff have been supporting the Covid-19 vaccination PODs in Las Vegas Convention Center, Cashman Center, community and senior centers in partnership with local fire departments, Touro, Roseman, and Nevada State College.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

1. There were no new reported childhood lead cases for the month of February.
2. There were no referrals for the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 145 active clients with 7 Nurse Home visitors. 50 are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA), consistently meeting the program's requirement. Telephone and video conferences continued to be utilized to engage clients in the program and to provide education, support and essential resources.

The entire Nurse-Family Partnership team has been participating in COVID-19 vaccination activities at the Las Vegas Convention Center.

C. Embracing Healthy Baby

The Southern Nevada Health District's Embracing Healthy Baby program has served 65 families since its inception. The Community Health Workers (CHWs) are managing cases with minimal guidance from the program Community Health Nurse. Telephone or virtual visits are currently being conducted with enrolled families. Education and referrals to needed services continue to be provided to families. Limited home visits remain halted due to the number of COVID-19 cases in Clark County.

The CHWs were heavily involved in COVID-19 vaccination activities in the month of February and they demonstrated the ability to balance program and COVID-19 vaccination needs. No outreach was conducted in the month of February.

III. Tuberculosis Clinic

- A. Four new active adult TB cases was reported by the TB Clinic during this period. There were no new pediatric active TB case reported by the TB Clinic during this period.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 6 adults in February.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic

- A. The clinic provided services provided 799 unique services to 626 unduplicated patients for the month of February. This is about 84% of last year's February numbers before COVID 19 restrictions and appointments and completed visits continue to increase.
- B. The Sexual Health Clinic is participating in two Learning Collaboratives under the Ending the HIV Epidemic efforts : 1) Community-wide Rapid stART Program through the Ryan White Part A grant recipient with the goal of decreasing the time from HIV diagnosis to treatment initiation and 2) STD Specialty Clinic Learning Community through the University of Washington's Prevention Training Center with the goal of scaling up HIV preventive services in STD specialty clinics.
- C. The SHC offers HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), non-occupational post-exposure prophylaxis (nPEP) services, and referral to primary care and support services. Services include screening for sexually transmitted infections, treatment and referral to a disease investigator for partner investigation.

- D. SHC staff attended several trainings in February including Mental Health First Aid, HIV Testing and Counseling for new staffs, Leadership training, and STD and HIV Clinical Updates.
- E. The vacant Community Health Nurse position was filled this month.
- F. SHC Express Testing was resumed on February 16, 2021. One new diagnosis of HIV was identified by the 2nd day the service was resumed.

V. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in February.
