Subject: Community Health Division Monthly Activity Report – February 2021

I. OFFICE OF CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION & HEALTH PROMOTION (OCDPHP)

A. Chronic Disease Prevention Program (CDPP)

As part of our REACH grant-funded efforts, the City of North Las Vegas City Council approved amendments to the North Las Vegas Municipal Code in January. Using input from the Bike and Pedestrian plan and other sources, revisions to the Municipal Code were drafted to increase bicycle access to employment, commercial and community destinations by providing safe and adequate parking facilities that meet the demands of the use, reduces hazards to pedestrians and enhances the visual environment.

As a result of the training/review provided in December by CDPHP for Clinical Services staff on the E.H.R referral protocol for patients with hypertension, diabetes and/or prediabetes, in January, CDPHP staff met with the manager of the Sexual Health Clinic to discuss the E.H.R. referral project for clients with hypertension, diabetes and/or prediabetes. The Sexual Health Clinic was not making E.H.R. referrals to our office for educational follow up (for appropriate clients) prior to that meeting. After the meeting, the Sexual Health manager worked with her team to develop a protocol for referring Sexual Health Clinic clients with hypertension, and diabetes/prediabetes that was in alignment with our SOP for the project. CDPP staff met with the Sexual Health Clinic's healthcare providers to provide a training in January and the Sexual Health Clinic will begin referrals for hypertension and diabetes/prediabetes in February. This now brings the total of SNHD clinics referring to our office for educational follow up for clients with hypertension, diabetes and/or prediabetes to 3.

CDPP is working with the City of Henderson and the Southern Nevada Food Council to update the Development Code in the city to increase access to healthy foods in convenience stores. As part of the effort, SNFC conducted research and prepared a report of best practices and model policies for similar work throughout the county. The report and the specific findings are being used as a model for the city to update their Development Code. Recommendations include encouraging convenience stores to carry staple foods and accept SNAP, WIC and EBT.

Standards also include store size, setbacks, design features, parking, and performance standards. Intercept surveys are planned for February at 3 convenience stores in Henderson to solicit input and increase community engagement. Findings from the research/report, intercept surveys, along with focus groups conducted last year will be used to prepare final updates for the Development Code scheduled later this year.

B. Tobacco Control Program (TCP)

Staff mailed out a second round of introduction letters and policy questionnaires to 46 behavioral health and substance abuse treatment facilities (BHSATF) in Clark County. Staff continues to update the tracking log to monitor incoming replies. The purpose of the policy questionnaire is to create a baseline of all policy types and policy needs at various BHSATF in our community. Staff is working closely with the American Lung Association to follow up and provide technical assistance to BHSATF to encourage and promote a tobacco-free campus policy.

Staff participated on the Nevada Youth Vaping Awareness Day Media Event on 1/26/2021. Staff along with other Statewide partners presented information about the vaping epidemic in Nevada. TCP staff provided resources for parents to help prevent youth initiation.

Staff is developing "No Menthol May," a campaign to help African Americans quit tobacco use by engaging with faith-based organizations that serve the African American community. No Menthol May is a nationally observed challenge to educate faith leaders, their congregations, and the community they serve about the harm caused by menthol tobacco products in the African American community. This month staff finalized the No Menthol May tool kit for the campaign and identified faith-organizations to participate.

Staff distributed a multi-unit housing (MUH) direct mail piece in conjunction with an email blast to over 3,700 MUH property managers, promoting smoke-free housing and available resources to encourage the adoption and expansion of smoke-free policies. A link to the previously referenced MUH policy expansion video was included in the email blast.

C. Other Efforts

OCDPHP was awarded a REACH Supplemental Flu award to promote the flu vaccine among REACH priority populations. CDPP team members are leading efforts to educate and engage important community stakeholders including promotoras, faith-leaders, and Community Health Workers. A paid, multi-component media campaign in English and Spanish began airing in November and will run through February. In January, 6 mobile flu clinics were scheduled in REACH priority zip codes with 68 people vaccinated. (To date totals = 25 mobile flu clinics in priority zip codes with 872 people vaccinated). In January, CDPP staff and partners participated in 24 events distributing flu vaccine information to over 3,100 people.

3. Disease and Outbreak Investigations

- a. 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19):** As of February 28th, Clark County had 226,871 cases, 3,858 deaths and 54 cases of MIS-C (Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome in Children). The Health District continues to utilize the Incident Command System to expand our efforts in COVID-19 Response and gain access to additional staffing and resources. The Health District continues to meet with the Clark County emergency managers, Fire, EMS, School Officials, hospital emergency response and infection control staff to communicate the current response and plan for continued partnership. The Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance (OEDS) at SNHD is receiving and following up on reports of suspected and confirmed illness, conducting disease investigations, contact tracing, providing assessment and evaluation information, and working with local medical providers to determine levels of risk and recommended actions for anyone who may be ill or exposed. OEDS is monitoring travelers from high risk countries for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 to detect and confirm any cases in Clark County. OEDS is making recommendations of isolation and quarantine for individuals that are diagnosed with COVID-19 or have been identified as exposed to someone with COVID-19. OEDS and the Southern Nevada Public Health Laboratory are working in coordination with Clark County hospitals and other medical providers to provide guidance for testing and sample collection for Clark County residents and visitors. Currently SNHD has contact tracers including staff from SNHD, UNLV and other partnering agencies. This is an ongoing response effort.
- b. Influenza:** The Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) Office of Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance (OEDS) began surveillance for the 2020– 2021 influenza season on September 27, 2020 and will continue through May 22, 2021. Influenza surveillance for Clark County, Nevada includes data collected from local acute care hospitals and other healthcare providers. In Clark County, for the season as of 2/27/2021, 31 influenza-associated hospitalizations and five deaths associated with influenza had been reported. Influenza A has been the dominant type circulating.

4. Non-communicable Reports and Updates

- a. Naloxone Training:** The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP) awarded SNHD with the First Responders-Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (FR-CARA) grant in September of 2017. The purpose of this 4-year FR-CARA grant is to train and distribute naloxone to first responders and members of other key community sectors throughout Nevada to better respond to the large-scale burden of opioid overdoses. Trainings continue in Nye County communities, Tonopah, and numerous first responder, medical, and treatment organizations. OEDS has implemented a policy for SNHD staff to carry and administer Naloxone. OEDS has also been given permission at the Clark County Detention Center to place Naloxone in a person's property at the facility.

The following Naloxone trainings/distributions have taken place in the month of February:

b. *Overdose Data to Action Grant (OD2A):* The Linkage to Action Team L2A) conducted their first community outreach with the mobile outreach vehicle on February 25. This effort was in collaboration with HELP of Southern Nevada, Foundation for Recovery, and The Center, to work with individuals in the community who may be experiencing substance use and may be vulnerable to overdose. The goal of the outreach was to provide harm reduction and education materials, as well as offer enrollment in our linkage services to assist with services needed to address their substance use needs and other co-occurring needs that may be barriers to successful linkage outcomes. The mobile outreach vehicle strives to meet individuals where they are including desert remote areas and encampments. During this outreach we provided 8 Naloxone kits.

B. Prevention- Community Outreach/Provider Outreach/Education

OEDS collaborated in February with the Southern NV HIV Awareness Consortium and Tim Care in observance of National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day on Friday, February 5, 2021. OEDS parked the L2A MTU onsite at Tim Care to offer HOME HIV test kit distribution, PrEP/PEP education and substance use, abuse and support referrals. The promotion for the event was via FB and social media. Local news outlet Fox Five News came to the event for an on-camera interview.

Ongoing promotion of Collect2Protect (C2P) online service for those requesting testing for gonorrhea, chlamydia, and HOME HIV test kits. OEDS has been working with OOC to help promote C2P on SNHD web sites, social media and with the help of community partners.

The Center, Huntridge Family Clinic and AHF continue to offer ongoing HIV/STD, PrEP/PEP and rapid stART services to the community.

Express Testing in SHC/Annex A has resumed as of February 16, 2021.

C. High Impact HIV/STD/Hepatitis Screening Sites

Testing is currently being offered at Trac-B for HIV and Hep C. Also, The Center is offering screenings for HIV, Hep C, Gonorrhea, Chlamydia and Syphilis to the community Mon-Thurs from 1pm-5pm. AHF is also offering HIV and STD screenings at their clinic locations.

IV. OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES & TRAUMA SYSTEM (OEMSTS)

A. Drug/Device/Protocol Committee (DDP)

The DDP Committee assists the OEMSTS, the Medical Advisory Board (MAB), and the QI Directors Committee in researching, developing, and editing new and existing protocols. Members include volunteer representatives from permitted agencies, receiving hospitals, and individuals involved with the training of EMS professionals.

The DDP continued their discussion of future revisions to the EMS Protocol Manual.

B. Medical Advisory Board (MAB)

The primary mission of the MAB is to support the Health Officer's role to ensure quality patient care within the EMS system by making recommendations and assisting in the ongoing design, operation, and evaluation of the EMS system from initial patient access to definitive patient care. The members include: 1) One medical director of each firefighting/franchised agency; 2) One operational director of each firefighting/franchised agency; 3) Chairman of the Regional Trauma Advisory Board; and 4) An employee of the District whose duties relate to the administration and enforcement of EMS Regulations as an ex-officio member.

The Board heard reports from the various sub-committees and will meet again next month for further discussion of pertinent issues.

V. OFFICE OF PUBLIC HEALTH PREPAREDNESS (OPHP)

A. Planning and Preparedness

1. Planning and Preparedness: Following President Biden’s directive, OPHP staff began working from home in support of the COVID-19 response. Manager, supervisor, senior planners, trainers, MRC volunteer coordinator, analyst and administrative staff may be serving in their SNHD and/or ICS positions in support of both SNHD and/or the MACC/MSST for the Southern Nevada community and hospital needs.
2. Following SNHD leadership direction, all non-essential meetings have been postponed for staff to attend all essential COVID-19, SNHD, community partner, and hospital meetings.

B. PHP Training and PH Workforce Development

1. Following SNHD leadership direction, all non-essential training has been postponed focusing on the COVID-19 response and training needs
2. Employee Fit Testing: Essential SNHD staff continue to receive respirator fit testing, 26 fit tests completed.

C. Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP)

4 FEB – SNHD hosted the February 2021 Southern Nevada Healthcare Preparedness Coalition virtually providing updates to the members on the current status of COVID-19 vaccinations, Vaccination Points of Dispensing (POD) roll out plan, and the Monoclonal Antibody Infusion Clinic at Sunrise Hospital. The community partners also provided the current status on COVID-19 operations in their jurisdiction including University Medical Center and the Encore Vaccination POD. Finally, the Chair briefed on the upcoming final planning meeting for the Medical Surge – BURN table-top exercise scheduled in April 2021.

9 FEB – SNHD met (virtually) with the state to conduct the southern Nevada Microplanning check in discussing vaccination doses, ordering, partners providing support, and issues with the vaccine (COVID-19 Vaccine) within the jurisdiction.

11 FEB – The Hospital Preparedness Program Liaison participated in the University Medical Center of Southern Nevada’s Emergency Management Committee meeting. The HPP liaison provided updates on the Southern Nevada

Healthcare Preparedness Coalition upcoming March 2021 meeting, first and second dose COVID-19 Vaccine clinics for the community, the final planning meeting for the table-top exercise in April 2021 focusing on burn patient/care delivery, update on providing a “quick hit” session for the National Association of City and County Health Officials (NACCHO) Preparedness Summit (a National Level Conference), the date of the Medical Surge – Burn Table-top Exercise in April 2021, and the National Healthcare Coalition Preparedness Conference in November-December 2021 in Orlando, Florida.

16 FEB – OPHP met (virtually) with the state to conduct the southern Nevada Microplanning check in discussing vaccination doses, ordering, partners providing support, and issues with the vaccine (COVID-19 Vaccine) within the jurisdiction.

17 FEB – OPHP provided National Incident Management System Instructor support to the jurisdiction providing support to Incident Command System level 400 course for the community at Task Force #1 location in North Las Vegas.

22 FEB – OPHP hosted the Final Planning Meeting for the Medical Surge – BURN table-top exercise (TTX) scheduled for April 2021. Hospital, jurisdictional, fire, law enforcement, and international airport partners participated in the meeting setting the final stage for the exercise. OPHP also hosted a meeting with subject matter experts from healthcare to identify medical supplies that will be in highest demand during an all-hazards event in the community and jurisdiction.

26 FEB – OPHP provided emergency preparedness training and technical assistance to seven staff members at Reliance Home Healthcare.

D. Grants and Administration

OPHP staff are supporting SNHD and MACC/MSST COVID-19 response and logistical needs.

E. Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) of Southern Nevada

The MRC coordinator works in conjunction with SNHD and community partners for volunteers needed for the COVID-19 response.

1. MRC volunteers are still suspended from regular positions at SNHD Main and East Clinics, Food Handler Safety Program, and Pharmacy due to restrictions of COVID-19. Medical and non-medical volunteers were deployed to four areas to support COVID-19 response activities: Medical volunteers at community test collection sites; Laboratory Assistants are assisting SNPHL with test accessioning, kit assembly, and general assistance; Medical and non-medical volunteers are performing contact tracing at SNHD OEDS, and one volunteer with Office of Public Health Informatics. Total “accepted” volunteers grew slightly to 406. The MRC Coordinator recruited, vetted, assigned, and deployed volunteers to all three sites and continues to recruit volunteers for test collection and vaccination sites, OEDS, and SNPHL positions and participate in planning and operations meetings as available.
2. A report with detailed hours will be included with April’s report.

VI. VITAL RECORDS

February 2021 showed a 19% decrease in birth certificate sales in comparison to February 2020. Death certificate sales showed a 50% increase for the same time frame. SNHD received revenues of \$35,646 for birth registrations, \$30,225 for death registrations; and an additional \$7,837 in miscellaneous fees for the month of February.
