RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Main clinic continues to be a COVID-19 mass vaccination site in the month of March. A total of 8,582 doses of Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines were administered at this site.
2. The immunization team continues to support receiving and distributing of COVID-19 vaccines to hospitals and community partners. A total of 244,980 doses of COVID-19 vaccines were received in the month of March (Pfizer 191,880 doses, Moderna 29,200 doses and Janssen 23,900 doses).
3. The East Las Vegas and Mesquite Immunization clinics continue to provide routine vaccines to the public by appointment only. East Las Vegas Immunization Clinic saw an influx of clients coming in for routine vaccination due to students returning to the school the temporarily closure of the Main and Henderson Immunization Clinics to support COVID-19 mass vaccination efforts. A total of 1,169 clients received 2,932 at the ELV PHC compared to March of last year's total of 558 clients.
4. There were 32 reminder calls made to parents/guardians of children 2-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations for the month of March.

B. Immunization Outreach Activities

1. A Flu clinic at Mater Academy- 3900 East Bonanza Rd Las Vegas, 89119 was held on Saturday, 3/13/21. There were 4 adults and 1 child who received the flu vaccine at no cost. The clinic is in partnership with Puentes Las Vegas. Since Covid-19 vaccination clinics started; flu clinics have significantly slowed down.
2. Staff have been supporting the Covid-19 vaccination PODs in Las Vegas Convention Center, Cashman Center, community and senior centers in partnership with local fire departments, Touro, Roseman, and Nevada State College.
3. Vaccination clinic at the Tunnels on March 25, 2021 was resumed. Janssen Covid-19 vaccines were administered to 7 eligible clients

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

1. There was one new reported childhood lead cases for the month of March.
2. There was one referral for the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 137 active clients with 7 Nurse Home visitors. 41 are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

This month, most services to enrolled families were provided by telephone and video conferences. In March, the program initiated limited home visits following established criteria.

The entire Nurse-Family Partnership team continues to participate in COVID-19 vaccination activities at the Las Vegas Convention Center.

C. Embracing Healthy Baby

The Southern Nevada Health District's Embracing Healthy Baby Program Community Health Workers (CHWs) are managing cases with minimal guidance from the program Community Health Nurse. Telephone or virtual visits continue with enrolled families. Education and referrals to needed services continue to be provided to families. Limited home visits were initiated in late March due to declining COVID cases in Clark County.

The CHWs were heavily involved in COVID-19 vaccination activities in the month of March and they demonstrated the ability to balance program and COVID-19 vaccination needs. No outreach was conducted in the month of March.

III. Tuberculosis Clinic

- A. Seven new active adult TB cases was reported by the TB Clinic during this period. There was no new pediatric active TB case reported by the TB Clinic during this period.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 0 adults in March.

IV. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in March.
