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# **Executive Summary**

In summary, all the departments continue to see an increase in activity and outreach. The Office of Communications issued 15 News Releases and responded to several media requests for interviews/statements from staff, mainly on Pediatric COVID-19 vaccine approval/availability and Thanksgiving safety tips. Many departments (Communications, Facilities, Clinical Services, Information Technology) worked towards the opening of the Health District's East Las Vegas health center location. The Finance Department noted that 1 grant expired, and 9 grants were awarded. As of November 26, 2021, the Health District had 738 active employees, with a total number of vacancies of 60.8 FTEs and a total number of positions in recruitment of 56.5 FTEs. The Human Resources Department posted 5 recruitments, conducted 96 interviews, extended 28 job offers and successfully completed 28 new hires. Many departments at the Health District continue to finalize the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) materials to submit for accreditation in early January 2022.



  - Accreditation processes owned by this team are:
    - Recruiting a full-time QI (Quality Improvement) Coordinator to work with staff across the district applying QI measurement and reporting to various projects driving positive impact
    - Executing the Workforce Development plan including
      - Training for all staff on QI and measurement principles
      - Building eLearning and live training opportunities for District Supervisors through Executives
- Assumed Chair position of Central Safety Committee
  - Exploring ways to upgrade the impact of this group though QI/Performance Management projects driving safety
