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Executive Summary

The Office of Communications issued two News Releases and provided support on initiatives related to smoking cessation and nutrition, along with developing digital content for The Perspective and District Dish employee newsletters. Staff further completed 52 project requests including graphic design, website content, advertising/marketing, outreach materials and translation services. Facilities staff installed privacy blinds throughout the FQHC, Sexual Health Clinic and Vital Records. Health Cards averaged 15 "passing and paying" online renewal clients per day, with a total of 459 clients renewing online. As of December 22, 2023, the Health District had 813 active employees. The Human Resources Department arranged 48 interviews, extended 19 job offers (seven offers declined) and successfully onboarded 5 new hires. There were two terminations, three promotions, nine flex-reclasses, one transfer and two demotions. There were eight recruitments posted. IT continued to develop a mobile wallet version of the food handler card. Related to the Public Health Infrastructure Grant, funding for Budget Period 2, A2 (Foundational Capabilities) was received. In accordance with NRS 41.0385, the Health District reports that we have had no claims for tortious conduct in 2023.

- 2. For the month of December, we averaged 15 "passing and paying" online renewal clients per day, with a total of 459 clients renewing online.
- 3. The IT department continues to develop a version of the food handler card that can be saved within a client's mobile wallet. This optional free offering would be in addition to the plastic card and the online renewal certificate.
