Certification and Licensure

Certification:

Emergency Medical Services certification at any level represents successful completion of an approved training program and subsequent completion of regulatory requirements. It is not a license to practice.

Licensure:

Emergency Medical Services licensure at any level represents the ability to practice at the level described on the license and is tied to the permit of the ambulance service employing the provider. Further limitations include that care as a licensed Emergency Medical Services provider may only be rendered while on duty in the position of provider for a permitted ambulance service at the scene of an emergency or while transporting to a receiving facility. Consideration is given to those who are providing Community Paramedicine Services.

Neither certification nor licensure confers the ability to practice as an Emergency Medical Services provider outside the regulations set by the Southern Nevada Health District Board of Health as authorized by Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 450B and promulgated by the Office of Emergency Medical Services & Trauma System.
