VI. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS/DISCUSSION ONLY

A. Bailey Way, UNLV Department of Psychology: "Presentation: The Condom-drum: College Students Attitudes Toward Condom Use in Pornography". [..\Bailey Way, College Students Attitudes Toward Condom Use in Pornography.pptx](#)

- i. Bailey's presentation explored reasons for watching pornography including sexual education, mood alteration and fantasy. This presentation shows the results of her research which surveyed college students' attitudes regarding condom use in adult film. Bailey also differentiates between "gay" and "straight" visual pornography. Historically, gay pornography has had more condom use due to policies that encouraged condom use in adult film production. However, with PrEP now developed there is less condom use depicted in adult film. Her research explores attitudes of adult film viewers toward condoms and if the general vote is in support of condom use, the narrative for film producers can change and keep actors safer.
- ii. Measures include frequency duration, STI history, and attitude questioner for condom use.
- iii. Results thus far show, 61% supportive, 19% ambivalent (great condoms are being used however will not watch if porn included condom use), 16% indifferent, and 5% critical. Women and MSM have been found more supportive of condom use.
 - 1. HPPG discussed the findings that those who have experienced a STI previously, were more against condom use, which was found interesting. This study represented data from both UNLV and Texas Tech. Conversation also suggested that condoms may ruin the fantasy element of adult film. Conversation also suggested STD testing and how HPPG can promote or even propose testing, services, and sex education through adult film production

B. Victoria Young, AETC: "Presentation: SB211 Toolkit"

- i. The Nevada Legislature passed Senate Bill 211(SB211), which became effective July 1, 2021. SB 211 is a new law requiring primary care providers, midwives, and hospital emergency departments to offer HIV/STI testing to all patients who are 15 years of age and older. PAETC

created a toolkit for providers so that they can easily obtain information faster and clearer on how they can implement in their offices/hospitals, [SB211 Provider Toolkit](#).

C. Discussion: Next Steps for Prevention from Nevada PrEP Institute April 5-6th, 2022.

- i. Purpose of the NV PrEP Institute is how to start a PrEP program or expansion/improvements opportunities.
- ii. Emergency Fund: Ending HIV Epidemic discussion of a PrEP emergency fund, for those who cannot afford or not insured/underinsured. Some states won't cover more than 4x's a year of STD testing. For instance, for young adults (26 and younger) who are under their parents' insurance may be fearful of parents finding a billing statement in which the dependent is listed as being on PrEP or getting tested for HIV/STIs. This fund could be a resource that can help get potential PrEP clients started on medication and later develop a better plan for medication access and adherence through a clinical/case manager.
- iii. Discussion of data retention perhaps using an existing electronic data base, something like WebZ, to upload history or plan to follow up with adherence, much like what DIIS do for HIV/STI investigations, PrEP navigators, etc.
