

SNHD Pediatric Early Warning Sentinel Surveillance (PEWSS) Report: January 11, 2012

General Update

During the week ending January 07, 2012, the following viruses were identified through PEWSS with a low volume of testing (Fig. 1): Adenovirus, Human Metapneumovirus and RSV.

Over the past five weeks (Tables 1 & 2), the following were identified in the community through PEWSS: Adenovirus and RSV have been circulating at low levels.

Influenza A, Human Metapneumovirus, Parainfluenza 1 and Parainfluenza 2 have been sporadically identified. Influenza B and Parainfluenza 3 have not been identified.

Figure 1 - Weekly Number of Specimens Tested

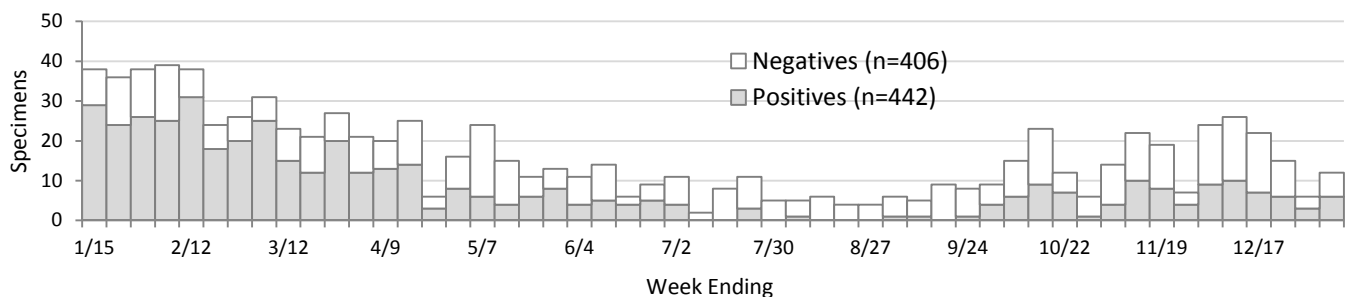
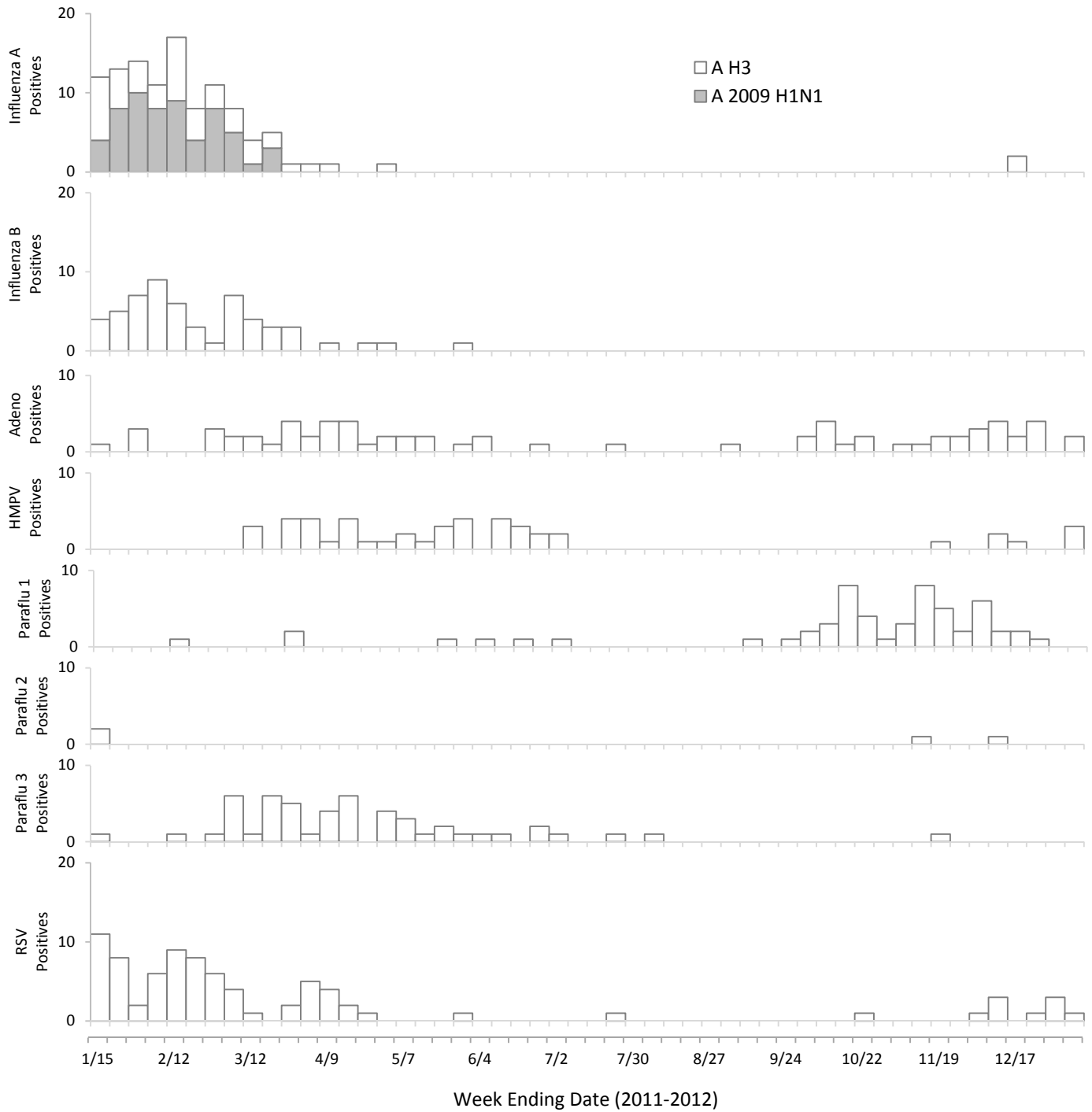


Figure 2. Weekly Positive Counts for Organisms Tested
