General Update

During the week ending October 13, 2012, the following virus was identified through PEWSS with a low volume of testing (Fig. 1): Parainfluenza 2.

Over the past five weeks (Tables 1 & 2), the following were identified in the community through PEWSS:

Parainfluenza 2 has been circulating at high levels.

Parainfluenza 3 has been circulating at low levels.

Influenza B and Adenovirus have been sporadically identified.

Influenza A, Human Metapneumovirus, Parainfluenza 1 and RSV have not been identified.





Other News and Information

Human parainfluenza virus (HPIV) -2 is circulating at a high level in Southern Nevada (Table 1; Fig. 2). Outbreaks of HPIV-2 often occur annually or biennially in the fall season. The most distinctive clinical feature of HPIV-2 is croup in infants and young children. Among older adults and patients with compromised immune systems, HPIVs infections can also result in serious lower respiratory tract disease (e.g., pneumonia, bronchitis, and bronchiolitis).
