## **General Update**

During the week ending November 23, 2013, the following viruses were identified through PEWSS with a low volume of testing (Fig. 1): Influenza A, Parainfluenza 1 and RSV.

Over the past five weeks (Tables 1 & 2), the following were identified in the community through PEWSS: Influenza A, Adenovirus, Human Metapneumovirus, Parainfluenza 1 and RSV have been sporadically identified. Influenza B, Parainfluenza 2 and Parainfluenza 3 have not been identified.





## **Other News and Information**

Influenza A 2009 H1N1 and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) were detected this week (Table 1; Fig. 2). Their appearances may indicate the beginning of influenza and RSV seasons in Southern Nevada.

Human parainfluenza virus-1 (HPIV-1) has been detected in seven of the last nine weeks. HPIV-1 is most often associated with croup (laryngotracheobronchitis) in children.
