General Update

During the week ending January 11, 2014, the following viruses were identified through PEWSS with a moderate volume of testing (Fig. 1): Influenza A, Adenovirus, Human Metapneumovirus and RSV.

Over the past five weeks (Tables 1 & 2), the following were identified in the community through PEWSS: Influenza A and Human Metapneumovirus have been circulating at high levels.

Adenovirus, Parainfluenza 1 and RSV have been sporadically identified.

Influenza B, Parainfluenza 2 and Parainfluenza 3 have not been identified.





Other News and Information

Influenza A is circulating at high level in Southern Nevada. This week, PEWSS detected both flu A 2009 H1N1 and flu A H3, which are strains that are included in the 2013-2014 flu vaccines. It is recommended that everyone > 6 months of age get a yearly flu vaccination.

Human Metapneumovirus (hMPV) is also circulating at high level this week. hMPV often circulates at the same time as RSV, and can cause upper respiratory tract infections such as pneumonia or bronchitis.
