

EMT-BASIC RECERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

There are three options to fulfill the EMT-Basic recertification requirement for continuing medical education (CME):*

- 1) Complete a 24-hour SNHD approved National Standard Basic Refresher Course; OR
- 2) Complete 24 hours of SNHD or CECBEMS approved CME classes biennially in the categories as listed in the table below. A minimum of 12 of the 24 hours **must** be done in a classroom setting. A maximum of 12 hours can be by distributive education, i.e. online, video or magazine-based.

Topics	Hours Required
Preparatory	1
Airway	2
OB, Infants, Children	2
Patient Assessment	3
Medical/Behavioral	4
Trauma	4
Miscellaneous	8
Total	24

In addition to the above, you must submit documentation of:

- Completion of a Health District approved (healthcare provider or professional rescuer) CPR course. The current expiration date must be valid through the month your Clark County certificate expires. Verification may be in the form of an instructor's signature on the course sign-in form or copies of both sides of the current CPR card. Note: The CPR course may not be applied toward CME hours; and
- Non-licensed providers must submit the District's completed Skills Proficiency Record at the level appropriate to the certification; or
- Permitted agencies must keep documentation of all skills on file for licensed providers as defined on the District's Skills Proficiency Record for audit purposes.

* All training records must be kept on file for a minimum of three years.
