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Nevada Medicaid Announces App to Access Digital Health Information

Las Vegas, NV – Nevadans enrolled in Medicaid can now download the NVMedicaid app for instant access to their health information, Nevada Medicaid ID card and broadcast messages. The app displays personalized information including health plan, and claims information including procedures. The app also allows recipients to find providers in their network.

“With better access to health information, we can make better choices about our health in partnership with doctors and caregivers,” said Suzanne Bierman, Administrator of the Nevada Division of Health Care Financing and Policy.

Nevadans aged 18 and older who are enrolled in Medicaid can access their claims information and Medicaid card, meaning there is no need to carry a physical card.
